# RESOLUTION CLOSING OPEN ENROLLMENT IN CERTAIN GRADES IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS

The School Board of ISD 877 is closing open enrollment, non-resident agreements and intra-district transfers in the Early Childhood Special Education Department for the 2009-10 school year, or until a future action of this Board rescinds this resolution during the 2009-10 school year.

#### Pokorney/Lee to approve

Discussion: Will continue to service our students and anyone who moves into our district. Motion carried 7-0

b. Buffalo High School Student Handbook Revisions, Mark Mischke

Changes include:

- Movement of SSR to the end of the day on Tuesdays and Thursdays to align with AAA schedule
- Eliminate Activity Bus Departure information due to the elimination of the Activity Bus as part of the 09-10 budget reductions
- Senior Privileges will begin at the start of fourth term and will be every day through the end of the school year
- Electronic Devices, i.e. cell phones, ipods, etc., that cause disruption are not allowed to be visible in classrooms, locker rooms, or lavatories unless preapproved by the instructor. Consequences are included.
- New Activity fee schedule

c. 2008-09 Budget Adjustments, Chuck Klaassen, Tina Burkholder

A detailed look at the budget takes place in the winter and spring and various projections are reviewed. Enrollment calculation was adjusted due to drop in enrollment throughout the year. Adjustments were made to various funds: \$210,000 revenue adjustment in E-rate and Microsoft funds due to a Microsoft settlement, insurance proceeds due to hail damage at the high school, expenditure adjustments due to contract negotiations, severance payments and unemployment costs.

Mattson/Mohwinkel to approve Discussion: Parking revenue – only \$54,000 was received compared to the projected \$60,000. Motion carried 7-0

d. Seasonal Layoffs, Chuck Klaassen

This prevents unemployment benefits.

**RESOLUTION – SEASONAL LAYOFF** 

Be it resolved, the Board of Education of ISD 877 Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose Schools approves seasonal leaves of absence to district employees who work in school-year positions less than twelve months a year, such leave being from the time they complete their 2008-09 duties until the scheduled return to work for the 2009-10 school year. Positions include food service personnel, paraprofessionals, clerical staff and other non-affiliated school-year employees.

Brings/Lee to approve Motion carried 7-0

e. Easement Agreement with Xcel Energy, Chuck Klaassen

Meetings have been taking place for a couple years. Xcel will run a new line that will cross the south side of the high school property and along the southern edge of the Tatanka property. Have been assured this will not interrupt access to these properties. We will receive approximately \$9200 from Excel for the easements on these two properties.

Asking for authorization for Director to enter into this agreement.

#### Lee/Mattson to approve

Discussion: When - Would take place this fall. Motion carried 7-0

f. Montrose Early Childhood Center Levy Resolution, Chuck Klaassen

Building and property are next to the Montrose Elementary site. A developer, Bauer Design/Build, wishes to purchase the property. We can enter into a lease agreement with them to house Early Childhood Family and Special Education programs.

#### Brings/Lee to approve

Discussion: Programming could take place at the site as early as this fall. Head Start will not be able to move into the building until one year later.

g. Resolution – Contract Discontinuance, Moreen Martell

Probationary staff member and is due to the uncertainty of Title I funding.

#### 6. **REPORTS**

a. Parent Involvement, Kim Carlson

Mini Grants have been awarded. Very interesting and worthwhile programs. Northwinds is looking at a volunteer program where parents sign up to help out with 3 events throughout the year. "3 for Me". Working on way to log number of volunteer hours that take place throughout the district during the year. National Volunteer Recognition Week in April – volunteers received notes with Hershey's kisses and coordinators were treated to a gathering at BJs deli. Donations were also received for these recognitions. Were able to give \$100 to each building to use as they need. Next year would like to hold a recognition for all the volunteers.

Discussion: Have heard that volunteer numbers have been declining – yes, this always happens at this time of the year.

b. BHS Activities Reductions, Tom Bauman, Mark Mischke

Have been discussing six activities these past months. Drumline and Dance Team will continue as Club activities next year. Alpine Ski and Speech will exist as co-op opportunities with St. Cloud and St. Michael-Albertville respectively. With the donation made this evening by the Nordic Ski Team, Boys Swimming and Diving and Nordic Ski will be able to self-fund their activities and continue as MSHSL activities at Buffalo High School.

Discussion: Money has been received from Swimming and Nordic Ski. This is a one-year agreement and would like to hear back how the self-funding is working with these two activities. Report pre-season and post-season next year.

c. Preliminary General Budget, Chuck Klaassen, Tina Burkholder

Used a 0% increase in state funding formula. 8% fund balance provides just under three weeks of funds necessary to run the district. Budget assumptions include a revision in projected enrollment, salary adjustments were revised to 0% - 2% from 2%-4%. Projecting \$49,365,657 in revenue and \$49,101,343 in expenditures for 2009-10. This budget would provide only a 6.3% fund balance in 2010-11 which goes against current district policy.

Discussion: We have to pay interest if we need to borrow money during the year – yes. With this budget, the district would be in SOD in 2011-12 – yes and this assumes the renewal of the current operating levies. Has reason for drop in enrollment been determined, such as foreclosures, etc. – no.

These are recommended language revisions from MSBA dealing with electronic recording of closed meetings and data on applicants for election or appointment to a public body.

## 7. DISTRICT COMMITTEE REPORTS

Olson – Community Ed Advisory – will need to draw \$11,000 from fund balance. Numbers are down for summer programming but will probably pick up.

Brings – Teaching and Learning Council and SEE

Mohwinkel – Safe Communities – working on stop lights at County Road 12 and Highway 55, also Advertising Committee is discussing possibility of signage at the football stadium as a two-year pilot. Our portion of the proceeds will be used for stadium improvements.
