CTE Community Dinner

The CTE department hosted a community advisory meeting on October 24, 2019 the Technology and Family Consumer Science classrooms. Mr. Roger Zentzis presented on CTE and Carl Perkins plans at BHS and solicited input from the community on work-based opportunities and needed skills in the community. Participants were greeted and served a three-course dinner by Mr. Joanne Grandstaff and students. Great discussion was had regarding what employers look for in a potential employee. Based on the input, a needs assessment for the Carl Perkins' grant will be drafted for our next grant. The CTE staff and students put on a great meeting!

 - Need licensed electricians and plumbers. Problem getting enough hours as an apprentice because the applicants do not want to travel away from home for work.
 - All students need to improve their "soft skills" Customer relations, verbal and written communication, following directions, no personal phone to be used on job, control temper, and time on assigned task.
 - c. GIS training would help for potential heavy equipment operators.
 - "Hospitals need more than doctors and nurses". Prepare students for the janitorial, reception, bookkeeping, maintenance and reception jobs.
 - e. All businesses need record keeping and spreadsheet skills time recording, expense and purchase accountability. Customer relations is necessary
 - f. "Watch what you put on social media it can come back to haunt you!"
 - g. Dress and act professionally when you show up for interview.
 - "Indian Days is NOT a paid holiday" workers need to realize taking time off repeatedly hurts the business that provides them a paycheck.
 - Job shadowing can work with hospital. Casino has age restrictions so job shadowing will generally not work.
 - ManPower offers housekeeping, culinary arts and customer service training using reallife contains.


Mrs. Broere has begun scheduled counseling groups which are helping the students and her caseload. She also serves the Babb Elementary.
