English Language Arts

Reading

Asks and answers questions about key details in text.

Describes characters, settings, and major events in a story, using key details.

Reading Level: (reported as semester and year)

Applies grade level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words.

Reads high frequency words with fluency.
