Student Transfer Policy – JFB and JFB-R

You will find enclosed School Board Policy JFB and JFB-R which deal with enrollment and student transfer requests. Administrative implementation of these policies result in our recommending student transfers be allowed for:

- A. Students with handicapping conditions recommended for a program provided at a school other than a home school
- B. The parent or legal guardian of a student is a fulltime employee in the school to which a transfer has been requested
- C. An extreme hardship
- D. A student will be allowed to continue in the school of previous enrollment for the third or sixth grade

If students are allowed to stay at a school outside of their home school zone (tuition students do not have a home school), the following issues may develop:

- A. The equity issue of transportation those who must ride the bus versus those who have automobile transportation
- B. Tardiness
- C. Overcrowding
- D. Disproportionate demographics our school sizes are so small a few students may a significant difference in the socioeconomic percentages attending individual schools
