CEMS AK STAR English/Mathematics & Alaska Science State Assessments

- As originally scheduled, CES students in grades 3-5 participated in AK STAR & AK Science Testing on Tuesday, April 5th (ELA), Wednesday, April 6th (MA), and Thursday, April 7th (SCI/5th only).
- CMS students in grades 6-8 participated in AK STAR & AK Science Testing on Tuesday, April 12th (ELA), Wednesday, April 13th (MA), and Thursday, April 14th (SCI/8th only).
- The CEMS provided an opportunity for CEMS Make-Up Testing from Monday, April 18th –
 Wednesday, April 20th. On Wednesday, April 20th the CEMS completed AK STAR and AK Science
 test administration.
- It's important to let the Board know that although the CEMS was successful in administering the computer-based state assessments, and minimal technology issues existed, the CEMS Staff and myself wasn't pleased with how testing went overall. The consensus was that NWEA missed the mark with appropriately gauging how long it would take students to test, especially at the elementary level. The CES did have students testing the entire school day, which is way too long for the developmental levels of our students. Additionally, concerns with test format were brought forward during CEMS Staff Meetings, in which our District Testing Coordinator, Cindy Glore, will provide to the State Assessment Office with the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development. I would be happy to speak to these additional concerns at the Board meeting, if necessary and/or requested.
- The primary reason these concerns are being mentioned now, is to create awareness at the Board level when CCSD/CEMS Assessment Results are received in the fall. It's imperative to take this information into consideration as it may provide a better insight into what the data may, or may not, represent. Granted, this year was the first year of AK STAR Assessment implementation in the State of Alaska; hence, perhaps the constructive feedback received from districts around the state will spark change prior to state testing next year.

Voices on the Land – CES 4th & 5th Grades

 As detailed directly from a flyer provided by Sealaska, Voices on the Land is a Sealaska Heritage education program that integrates storytelling, performing arts, formline design, and digital storytelling into local schools to help students create theatrical productions, songs, scripts, and digital stories based on traditional knowledge.

Voices on the Land, a Sealaska Heritage education program, integrates storytelling, performing arts, formline design, and digital storytelling into local schools to help students create theatrical productions, songs, scripts, and digital stories based on traditional knowledge.

Over the next three years, the Voices on the Land program will explore the artistic and cultural ways we tell stories through in-school artist residencies. Each residency incorporates lessons that help students strengthen literacy skills corresponding to narrative, language, speaking, and listening at grade-level standards.

Performing Arts Residency

Theater, Tlingit culture and music. This residency culminates in a student showcase. Students will share Tlingit children's songs and a Raven story with soundscape accompaniment.

Graphic Arts Residency

Storytelling through Northwest Coast formline design. Students explore the connection between the people, stories, and land using formline design to visualize traditional stories and original student works.

Digital Storytelling Residency

Visual arts exploration and stop motion animation as an entry point to exploring traditional and personal storytelling. Students will learn to utilize contemporary technologies as creators rather than consumers as they develop skills to share their stories.
