

Saul Hinojosa Accomplishments

- 1. As a school principal, school ratings were consistently Acceptable or better.
 - In 1991-1992, Norman Thomas Elementary received a Recognized school rating.
 - In 1997-1998 and 1998-1999, Freer High School received a Recognized rating and an Exemplary rating for the years 1999-2000; 2000-2001; 2001-2002; 2002-2003.
- 2. I initiated the elementary UIL academic competition around 1980. The campus excelled and placed first in 80 percent or more in meet participation.
- 3. I supported UIL academic competition at Freer High School where it was practically nonexistent. Our students and school competed well and placed against students in every school classification up to 5A. In district competition, we continually won first place or came considerably close. It was the norm to send 30 to 45 qualifying students to the regional meet and several to the state meet where many placed.
- 4. The Freer High School band had 29 students including 7th and 8th graders. It was not unusual to have them rated at 3 or lower in competition. After recruiting a more compatible band director, the band grew to over 100 students including the addition of a drill/dance team. Eventually the band was composed of mostly high school students. Ratings improved to 1's and 2's and the band garnered a Sweepstakes trophy in 2001, something they had not done since the 1960's.
- 5. Our athletic program was recognized by our district for Best Sportsmanship several times.
- 6. I was named ATPE Region II Elementary Principal of the Year.
- Benavides Secondary School was rated Academically Unacceptable when I was hired in January 2010. Through hard work and dedicated teamwork, we were rated Acceptable for that school year and again for the 2010-2011 school year when we also satisfied AYP requirements.

I was raised on a dairy farm where we also grew watermelons, corn, hay, broom corn, etc. In addition, I have raised beef cattle since I was in high school.

While attending college, I worked as a fry cook, carpet and linoleum flooring installer helper, general maintenance, farmer and rancher.

During weekends and holidays, I worked as an assistant sports department manager at HEB and as a substitute floor hand (rough neck). While I was teaching, I also worked with a surveying crew during the 1969 summer for Zachary Construction Co.




