## Apqusaanaravut uqautchiptigun

What we have endured with our language.

Piyuktauŋarugut miqłiqtuuŋŋapta miŋuaqtuġvigmi We were treated with corporal punishment also known as domestic violence in our early years of education.

There are many stories of residents of my age and older that experienced the trauma, some worse than others. For the fear of being hit, we hid the usage of our language to almost extinction. If you have not heard, the Inupiaq language is on the endangered Language list of the United Nations.

It gets lonely not having anyone to speak Inupiaq with, and I'm certain that it is the same in the villages for some of our elders.
