STUDENT DRESS CODE (GRADES PK-5)

STUDENTS MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH DRESS CODE ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.		
General	 Clothes shall be worn to the appropriate size for each student. Appropriate undergarments shall be worn at all times and not be visible. Students' hair shall be clean, neat, and well-groomed in appearance. Hats and caps are prohibited, except on days approved by the campus principal. 	
Shirts	 Any shirt or blouse as long as it is not revealing or promotes anything deemed inappropriate or offensive. Spirit/Club/Organization/Athletic shirts may be worn on any day. Shirts must be worn below the natural waist. Shirts must be worn below the natural waist. Shirts may be worn untucked provided they are not longer than the split of the pants. Midriff must not be visible when hands are raised above the head. Any undershirts may be worn under a student's shirt. 	
Bottoms Pants/Shorts/Skirts	 Any pants or jeans, walking shorts, skirts, skorts, or capris may be worn. Pants and shorts must be worn on the waist and are not to sag or fit baggy. Clothing may not be more than 2 inches above the knee. 	
Jackets Outerwear	 Parents/students are expected to use good judgment when choosing appropriate winter outerwear. Hoods are not to be worn inside the school building or classroom. Hoodies/jackets must be free from emblems or images that may be controversial or inappropriate for an educational setting. Hoods are not to be worn inside the school building or classroom. Clothes shall be worn to the appropriate size for each student. Appropriate undergarments shall be worn at all times and not be visible. Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times. Students' hair shall be clean, neat and well groomed in appearance. Hats and caps are prohibited, except on designated days approved by the campus principal. 	
Footwear	 Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times. Tennis shoes must be worn for PE. The following are prohibited: house shoes, beach sandals, or any other footwear that has toes reinforced with steel, hard plastic, or similar materials.

DRESS CODE ENFORCEMENT

STUDENTS MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE DRESS CODE ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

All students attending Robstown ISD schools will be required to wear the following:

Tops

- Any shirt or blouse as long as it is not revealing or promotes anything deemed inappropriate or
 offensive.
- Spirit/Club/Organization/Athletic shirts may be worn on any day. Shirts must be worn below natural waist.
- Shirts may be worn untucked provided they are not longer than the split of the pants.
- Midriff must not be visible when hands are raised above the head.
- Any undershirts may be worn under a student's shirt.

Bottoms

- Any pants or jeans, walking shorts, skirts, skorts or capris may be worn.
- Pants and shorts must be worn on the waist and are not to sag or fit baggy.
- Clothing may not be more than 2 inches above the knee.

Jackets

- Parents/students are expected to use good judgement when choosing appropriate winter outerwear.
- Hoods are not to be worn inside the school building or classroom. Hoodies/jackets must be free from emblems or images that may be controversial or inappropriate for an educational setting

STUDENTS MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH DRESS CODE ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.		
Shirts	 Spirit/Club/Organization/Athletics shirts may be worn on any day. T-shirts, Polo's or Oxford shirts Any T-shirt may be worn as long as they are not see-through, sleeveless, cut-offs, midriffs, or advertise offensive or prohibited messages. Solid white T-shirts are not allowed. 	
Pants	 Any style of pants or jeans are allowed. Shorts are allowed. Shorts must be one inch above the knee. Warm-ups, wind pants, and sweatpants are allowed as long as they are not revealing or promoting anything deemed inappropriate or offensive. No leggings, tights, pajama pants, yoga pants, or workout pants allowed. Fit: Must fit properly around the waist, and must be appropriately sized. Oversized baggy jeans and cargo pants are inappropriate. Pants worn below the waist "sagging" garments are not allowed. 	
Sweaters/Vests	 Color: Any Color Must be appropriately sized. Must be worn over a T-shirt, oxford shirt, or polo-style shirt 	
Turtle Necks	 Color: Any Color Must be appropriately sized Must be worn under a T-shirt, oxford shirt, or polo-style shirt 	
Jackets	 Hoods are not to be worn inside the school building or classroom. Hoodies/jackets must be free from emblems or images that may be controversial or inappropriate for an educational setting. Must be appropriately sized Logos, designs, or lettering that is considered lewd, offensive, vulgar, and obscene OR advertise or depict tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other substance prohibited under FNCF (LEGAL) will not be allowed. Note: RECHS Letterman Jackets are permitted. 	
Footwear	 Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times. The following are prohibited: house shoes, beach sandals, or any other footwear that has toes reinforced with steel, hard plastic, or similar materials. Welders may wear reinforced-toe shoes in the welding lab. 	
Hair	 Hair must be clean and well-groomed at all times and kept out of the eyes. Hairstyles that are extreme or disruptive, as determined by the administration, will not be tolerated. Facial hair will be allowed as long as it is kept short and neatly groomed. 	
Accessories	Inappropriate tattoos must be covered.	

NOT ALLOWED

- Solid white T shirts are not allowed, Gang-related attire clothing apparel that is associated with gangs such as belts, colored handkerchiefs, etc.
- No article of clothing or other accessories shall be worn in such a way as to advertise, promote, or be associated with sex, violence, alcohol, drugs, death, hate slogans, or gang activities or pictures (as defined under FNCF-LEGAL).
