- Provide an alternate educational experience for students struggling in the traditional setting (academic, behavioral, emotional)

Student Enrollment Information

RAISE Academy 9-12

- 15 students
 - 13 students in-person
 - 2 students remote

RAISE Academy 6-8

- 4 students
 - 2 students in-person
 - 1 student hybrid
 - 1 student remote



2020-2021 Updates

- Second year of program run by DPS
- Middle School Program expanded to offer support for 6th graders
- Constellations provides behavioral support (1 RBT)
- DPS teachers providing instruction in all core classes for HS/MS with the exception on Social Studies
- Middle School students offered classes in DMS every school day
- Risk Factor Rating Scales used to track student progress
 - Attendance, Academics, and Behavior
- In-person option for students during planned remote learning
- SEL class (twice per week) offered to HS school students

2020-2021 Staffing

- 2 DHS English Teachers

- 1 DHS Social Worker (as services required; two class periods a week for SEL)

- ***Push-out support***

- DMS Music, Art, and World Language (once a week)
- DMS PE (twice a week)
- DMS ELA (four days a week)
- DHS Electives (as scheduled for RAISE Academy students)

2020-2021 General Notes

- Program well-supported by DPS Administration
- Amazing job by DPS Push-In Staff
- Excited to have RAISE MS students participating in DMS classes
- Disproportionate student numbers (HS vs MS) has presented challenges
- An additional support staff member (RBT or Para) would be helpful
- Significant increase in student online participation as compared to last Spring
- Continued review of Risk Rating Data to help inform effectiveness of practice
- Development of transitional support programming
- Continue to target attendance barriers to reduce student risk
