

Parkrose Summer Programs 2011

Boys and Girls Club Summer Program at Prescott

- 6/27-8/5
- 100 students, Grades 1-5, from all Parkrose Schools
- Daily recreation/craft/art activities
- Lunch provided

Shaver Summer School

- 7/11-8/5, Mon-Thurs
- 117 students, entering K-5th at Shaver
- Garden/Nature Theme, Instruction in reading, math, writing, research skills
- Staffed by Shaver teachers, SUN, Eastern OR University Reading Endorsement teachers, and PHS Gateway Project students
- Funding support from Title I School Improvement grant, McKinney-Vento grant, SUN

PHS Programs

- Roundup-Served 46 incoming 9th grade students at academic risk. Focused on reading and math skills. Pre/post assessment showed gains, but not at statistically significant level.
- PLATO Credit Recovery-Served 68 students, 23 credits earned, 60 credits pending offline work , average credits (including credits from pending work): 1.21
- Jumpstart- Served 26 students, focused on English Language Development skills and Reading, earned .5 Elective credit.
- Career/College Connection (C3)-Served 23 incoming 10th grade academic priority students. Focused on Educational Plan & Profile activities, weekly college site visits.
- Stampede- 65 students confirmed, takes place 8/22-26

Kindergarten-Kids were learning how to be at school. Line up, eat breakfast and lunch, pick up a pencil, go to carpet, use scissors, work on alphabet.

First Grade- There were five stations everyday, focusing on Literacy, Math, Writing, Science and Nature.

Second Grade-Instruction focused on reading decoding and math concepts and basic addition. They also

worked in the Shaver garden.

Third Grade-Emphasis on reading and the garden.

Fourth grade-Focused on nonfiction reading, math, research skills and they created a blog

Fifth grade-Reading, focusing on nonfiction texts and research skills, math
