
IN ERA ISD WE BELIEVE...

<u>Secondary:</u>

- Continued implementation of yearly scope and sequence (mapping of curriculum)
- IStation Reading screener administered to all students in grades 6-8; Mr Johnson is having follow-up meetings with reading teachers to review screener data and determine how to group students to support them based on the results
- Currently, about half of Secondary teachers utilize Eduphoria to house their data from assessments. The other half of the Secondary teachers have individual systems for housing their data. Mr. Johnson is continuing to determine the best way to ensure all data is being monitored, regardless of the system being used.

Elementary:

- Implementation of yearly scope and sequence (mapping of curriculum)
- Currently, standardized assessments are administered at least three times a year as a progress monitoring measure in the area of reading and math.
- We continue to drill down into individual student results to determine individual student's growth. This will assist us in finding a formula to represent a full year's progress and measure each student against that formula.
- Grades 3-5 are also continuing to create assessments for measuring progress in core subjects through TEKS aligned assessments in Eduphoria.

STAAR Redesign 2023:

- There is a complete redesign of STAAR coming this year along with a reset of the State's Accountability System. TEA is "strongly recommending two at-bats" for students prior to taking STAAR in the spring.
- We will be using TEA's Interim Assessments as our "at-bats" to help teachers and students become familiar with the new question types, with the first round happening this month.

Beginning of Year Data - Reading

- Kindergarten- 32% at or above grade level; 68% below or well below grade level
- First Grade- 80% at or below grade level; 20% below or well below grade level
- Second Grade- 59% at or above grade level; 41% below or well below grade level

Combined Average- 57% K-2 Students on grade level to begin the year. In comparison, last year's beginning of year average was 45%, as measured by Ampify's Indicators of Progress.




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iStation Reading September 2022





Beginning of Year Data- Reading(Istation)

- K- 45% at or above grade level; 56% below grade level
- 1-83% at or above grade level; 17% below grade level
- 2- 60% at or above grade level; 40% below grade level
- 3- 48% at or above grade level; 53% below grade level
- 4- 39% at or above grade level; 62% below grade level
- 5- 61% at or above grade level; 39% below grade level

Combined Average- 56% K-5 Students on grade level to begin the year. In comparison, last year's beginning of year average was 66%, as measured by Istation's Indicators of Progress.

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

Beginning of Year Data- Reading(iStation)

- 6 71% at or above grade level; 29% below grade level
- 7 70% at or above grade level; 30% below grade level
- 8 42% at or above grade level; 58% below grade level

This was the first year to screen the 6-8th grades using this platform, therefore we have no comparative data. ***STAAR interim testing will take place mid-November to provide predictor of STAAR outcomes.





Beginning of Year Data - Math

- K- 50% at or above grade level; 50% below grade level
- 1-26% at or above grade level; 74% below grade level
- 2- 37% at or above grade level; 63% below grade level
- 3- 20% at or above grade level; 80% below grade level
- 4- 33% at or above grade level; 67% below grade level
- 5- 32% at or above grade level; 68% below grade level

Combined Average- 33% K-5 Students on grade level to begin the year. In comparison, last year's beginning of year average was 47%.

****During the initial assessment, the program malfunctioned in several classes, not allowing students to finish completely. Therefore this data could potentially be skewed. *****STAAR interim testing will take place mid-November to provide predictor of STAAR outcomes.
