# Administrators for Accountability & Program Improvement (C. Geiger, T. Hassett, M. Sly):

- The GSM Team has worked together to identify the needs for and develop a county wide General Supervision Monitoring Plan Manual. The Manual describes the vision and roadmap for ICISD to support and monitor the 5 LEAs in the county. This Plan and General Supervision Monitoring activities will ensure that our local districts know the requirements of IDEA and implement the requirements with fidelity. The GSM Team will support the LEAs in identifying any professional development needed, how to collect and analyze data effectively, and provide targeted technical assistance.
- The ICISD General Supervision Team met on 11/22/24 with each of the 5 district's special education coordinators/directors to review LEA data pertaining to the Grant focus area of Graduation Rates. The team determined that with the assistance of the ICISD GSSG Team, each LEA will evaluate data input procedures and processes to ensure valid and reliable data. As part of Graduation Rates, the causal factors of Discipline, Absenteeism, the Least Restrictive Environment, State Assessment rates, and the use of Personal Curriculums play into graduation outcomes. The team identified Discipline and Absenteeism as the LEA's priority areas. Available data in MSDS, Skyward, and SWIS demonstrated inconsistencies leading to the discussion of what action steps are needed to mediate missing and incongruent data.
- The GSM team and two LEA directors will complete file reviews to measure compliant IEP goal writing, clear statements of Supplementary Aids and Services, and thorough documentation of IEP Notice statements on December 11.

• Commitment to Restorative Practices: Our SEI program has shown exceptional success in implementing trauma-



informed strategies and restorative practices. As of November 27th, the program reports zero incidents of restraints, seclusions, or suspensions, highlighting the effectiveness of their approach.

 Professional Development: The SEI team has scheduled additional district-provided professional development. On December 5th, they will participate in a full-day training with Robin Gobell, author of *Baffling Behavior,* at Right Door. On December 6th, FBA (Functional Behavior Assessment) and BIP (Behavior Intervention Plan) training for teachers, principal, and behavior coach.
