
You submitted a Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") request to Riverside Public School District 96 (the "District") on June 17, 2025 after business hours. The District received your request on June 18, 2025. Your request and the District's responses are below:

Request: ANY AND ALL INFORMATION INCLUDING SALARY, RESUME, NOTES, MEMORANDA, INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPTS, OR OTHER DOCUMENTATION IN YOUR POSSESSION AND CONTROL REGARDING MOLLY MARQUARDT, DIRECTOR OF TECHNOLOGY, APPOINTED BY THE SCHOOL BOARD ON FEBRUARY 19, 2025.

Response: Enclosed please find records responsive to your request. I redacted a personal phone number, personal email address, home address, and signatures, which constitute private information under the FOIA and may be redacted. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b). Further, signatures constitute personal information under the FOIA and may be redacted. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). Providing such information would be an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, and the release of such information would be objectionable to a reasonable person. The individual's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.

You have the right to have the denials reviewed by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) at the Office of the Illinois Attorney General. 5 ILCS 140/9.5(a). You can file your Request for Review with the PAC by writing to: Public Access Counselor, Office of the Attorney General, 500 South 2nd Street Springfield, Illinois 62701, Fax: 217-782-1396, E-mail: public.access@ilag.gov, Phone: 877-299-3642. If you choose to file a Request for Review with the PAC, you must do so within 60 calendar days after the date of the denial letter. 5 ILCS 140/9.5(a). Please note that you must include a copy of your original request for documents and the denial letter when filing a Request for Review with the PAC. You also have the right to seek judicial review of your denial by filing a lawsuit in the State circuit court. 5 ILCS 140/11.
