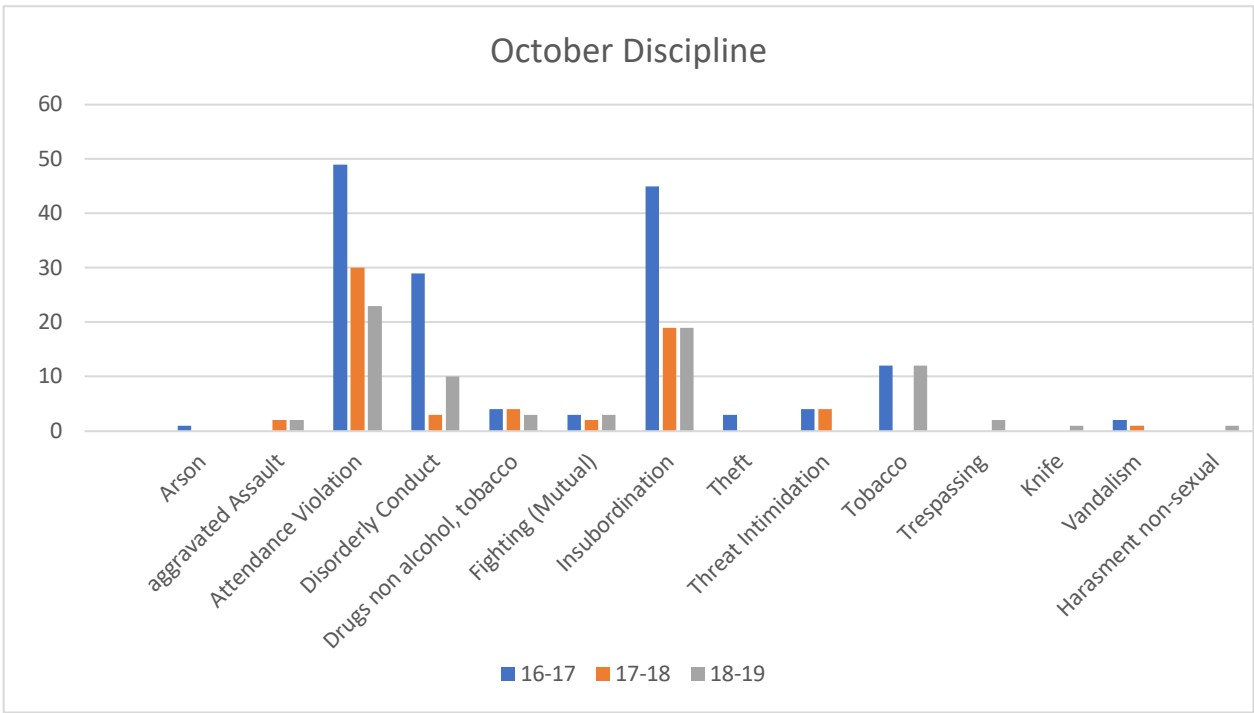

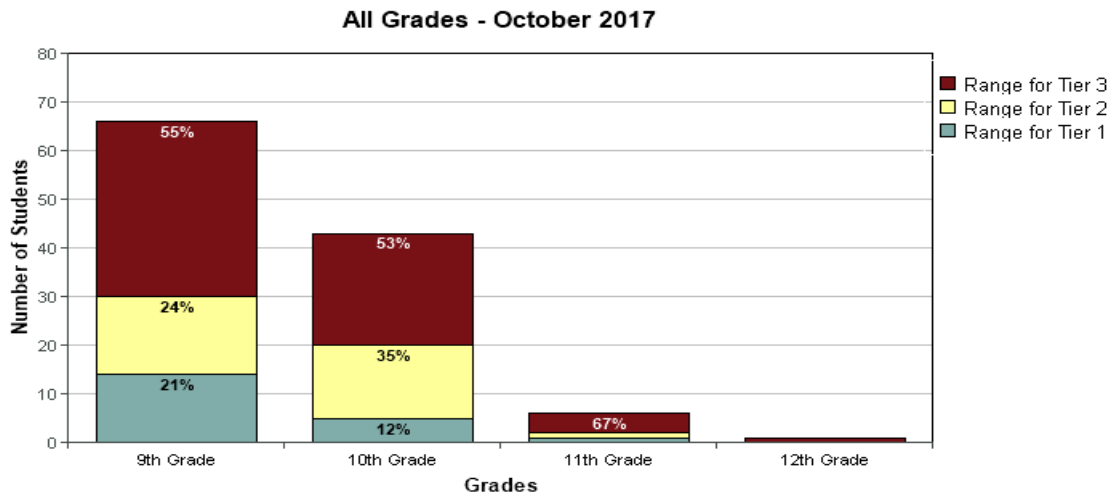
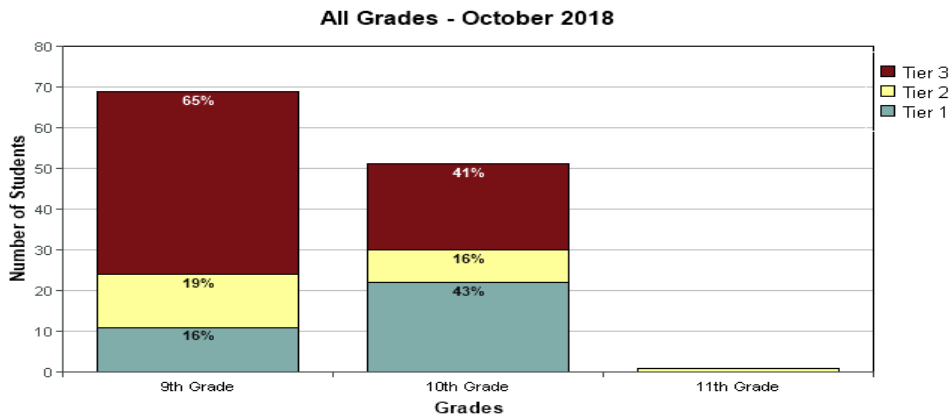

ISIP-Literacy Assessment

Listed below are the ISIP results for October. After the initial benchmark assessment in September we progress monitor students who had scored into the Tier 2 and 3 range. The results do show that a number of students are now scoring into the Tier 1 range. These are mainly students who were “on the bubble” or scored in the high Tier 2 range in September. I have included the October 2017 results for comparison.



MBI Youth Days:

BHS had six students attend the MBI Youth Days conference put on by OPI. The students are: Preston Tatsey, Wesley Pree, Keenan Rides at the Door, Shante' Spino, Ali Archambault, and Chelsea Bullshoe.

The theme for the 2018 Inclusive Youth Days is— *Embracing Diversity Through Story*. The MBI/MTSS was put on in partnership with SOMT's Unified Champion Schools program, under

the leadership of Megan Hill and the Youth Activation Committee (YAC). Organizers also included the Youth Leadership Group overseen by Mr. Donnie Wetzel. The student- led groups have put on some phenomenal conferences over the last couple of years. Featured presenters at the conference were:

1. **Oscar McBride**, back by popular demand for the third year in a row, Oscar is beyond excited to promote diversity and acceptance as he continues to share his story with the Montana Youth. Oscar brings his experiences as a Division 1 athlete at the University of Notre Dame, a professional athlete in the NFL, teacher, coach, and educational leader.

2. **Bruce Colton** returns as one of the featured speakers and workshop facilitators. Bruce will once again deliver his passion for student health and wellness in his energetic and engaging style.

3. **Megan Hill** is the coordinator of the SOMT's Unified Champion Schools and Youth Activation Committee. She will direct her student leadership group and serve as the main conference facilitator.

4. **Donnie Wetzel** is the American Indian Youth Development Coordinator at the Indian Ed division of OPI and will oversee his youth leadership group while inspiring through his own story.

The BHS students participated in a number of leadership development and team building activities while at the conference.
