 a supportive service. The MOCC will <u>only</u> fund G17 Substance Abuse Testing for the following
 populations: 1) Sentenced felons participating in a treatment court; 2) Offenders convicted of
 a felony placed on Delayed or Deferred Sentence who are participating in a treatment court; 3)
 Pretrial defendants on Pretrial Supervision with a documented history/need for substance
 abuse testing.
- Supportive documentation, including Court Order, must be on file for all enrollments.
- "Treatment Court" is defined as: Drug Court, Sobriety Court, Hybrid Treatment Court, Mental Health Court, or Veterans Court. Please note: Swift and Sure Sanctions Probation is NOT a treatment court and is NOT eligible for this service.
- Substance Abuse Testing Best Practice Standards must be followed.
- This service must comply with Section 2 of CFR-42.
- Because substance abuse testing is part of the Treatment Court model, eligibility screening and substance abuse testing intake/orientation cannot be billed to P.A. 511 funding.

□Not compliant □Compliant - How: Oral/saliva tests are used in place of same gender observed testing when staff are not available. Urine screening with same gender observed testing is standard. If the defendant admits using this is documented and if they do not the sample is stored and sent to the laboratory for test confirmation. For those utilizing PBT units daily they have the option to conduct a urine screen with an ETG 2 times per week as an alternative.
7) Confirmation Testing - A confirmation should be mandatory unless the participant admit use on a positive test, • Sanctions should not be imposed without a confirmation or admission • Confirmatory tests are not withheld due to the participant's inability to pay Not compliant Compliant - How: If defendant does not admit use when testing positive for substances, test is sent to Redwood for lab testing the day the test is completed Oral/Saliva testing is utilized in Crawford, Otsego, and Alpena Counties as means to address a lack of available male staff with lab confirmation for all presumtive positive tests. Reports are sent directly to Community Corrections. PA511 funding allows testing costs to be covered when the defendant if unable to afford the cost of testing.
8) Use of Levels - Cutoff levels are not interpreted as evidence of new substance use or change in participants' substance use patterns. □Not compliant □Compliant - How: Length of time after use is considered fo testing positive. Once the defendant has tested positive staff waits until substance lifespan ha expired to consider new use.
9) Chain of Custody - A chain of custody form is completed once a urine sample has been collected. This form ensures the identity and integrity of the sample through transport, testing and reporting of results. Not Compliant Compliant - How: Testing chain of custody is maintained within the testing location. All staff who test have completed basic training on chain of custody and the process for lab testing. Once the test is completed, it is closed and locked (per the manufacture instructions) in front of the client. If the test is negative, it is thrown in the garbage in front of the defendant. If the test is presumtive positive, it is put in a sealed bag in front of the defendant, once sealed it cannot be opened. The sameple is then mailed to the lab. If a sample has broken chain of custody it is not considered as evidence.
10) Test Results - Test results, including the results of confirmation testing, are available to the drug court within 48 hours of sample collection. □Not compliant □Compliant - How: Results are reported to Community Corrections immediately after completion. Positive tests that have been sent to the lab are communicated and test results are reported immediately after they are received. Community

Corrections staff reports this to the courts within 24 hours of receipt.
