Let's Play with Clay! - Patty Parker, K-4: We will be creating hand-built pottery, painting ceramics and having basic art lessons on color and drawing. This class is always fun and students make some beautiful pottery to take home!

Glow Games- Theresa Winter, K-2: How will your summer GLOW?? Come join us for this "glowing" opportunity for fun! We will explore the science behind things that glow, participate in a glow scavenger hunt, create glowing art, and explore glow-in-the-dark science! Throughout the week students will build, design, and create with glowing supplies and end the week with a morning of glow games. So come brighten your summer with a week of all things that glow!

Ready, Set, Build! – Shannon Carlisle / Keila Glenn, 2-4: Students will build Legos and use their imagination to develop and create narratives, characters and story lines. After constructing stories, students will use the Lego StoryVisualizer app on iPads to sequence their stories and take pictures of their creations. They will produce a sequenced, completed multidisciplinary artifact each day.

Bonjour Y'all! - Clark Parker, 3-7: Would you like to surprise your friends with a few French phrases? Then come join us at this camp, where we will learn French facts and basic French vocabulary such as numbers, colors, days of the week & clothing. Students will help make basic foods such as fondue, crepes and macaroons.

Camp Robin Hood-Robert Pressley, 3-7: Come learn the basics of competitive archery. This camp will help build a foundation necessary to compete on the school archery team. Safety, rules, and technique will be taught.

Wild about Walter Anderson- Debra Long, 3-7: Students will dive into the world of Mississippi artist Walter Anderson. Students will explore art journaling, watercolor, and printmaking as we explore the life and work of this exciting artist. Students will create art pieces to bring home.

June 11-15.

Camp Share-a-Story! – Cassidy Rhoades, K-2: During "Camp Share a Story" we will read a new book each day and do an activity that goes along with the story. We will sing, act out, and dress like story characters. Come join the fun at Camp Share a Story!

Making Waves - Madi Martin West, K-2: The oceans cover over 70% of our planet. Come join our camp to experiment and learn about what goes on in all that water and create beautiful art pieces inspired by the seas. Hope to SEA you there!

Smarter, Better, Faster... – Maria Holland Foster, 2-4: Do you want to improve your math skills while moving your body in a variety of different ways? You will use movement and fitness to practice math concepts and gain fluency in the 4 major math operations. You will learn creative and active ways to remember difficult math concepts and participate in "Fluency Fitness" and practice samplings of yoga, light weight lifting, aerobic exercise, and competition games while becoming a smarter, better, faster, stronger mathematician! Don't forget, MATH MOVES!

BeYOUtiful Girls Rock- Cynthia Wright- 2-4: Through an innovative experience, girls will focus on topics such as leadership skills, peer pressure, health and nutrition, and stress management to gain skills and attitudes that are required to form and maintain a healthy positive sense of self. Each day the girls will participate in a follow-up activity such as role playing, vision board design, spa day, etc. Prizes will be drawn daily!!!

Spies and CSIs – Dana Daugherty, 2-4: Have you ever wondered how crimes are solved? During this camp, each participant becomes a crime scene investigator and will put their new skills to work as they solve crimes using a variety of methods. Students will learn how to take evidence such as fingerprints and handwriting and apply their findings to solve a case. These investigations will help students improve their reasoning skills in a fun environment! They must work together to solve these crimes and keep the criminals from striking again!

Science in Motion - B. Boatner/J. Begnaud, 3-7: Explore the world of physics and biology in the form of games and other physical activities not typically involved in common elementary P.E. classes. Students will also explore more traditional "hands on" science experiments. Activities will include archery, model rockets, liquid nitrogen, night vision equipment and games.

Musical Madness – Leslie Jones, 3-7: Music Madness will allow students to learn instruments such as the ukulele, keyboard, drum set, recorder, flute, djembe and trumpet. The students will not only be able to play these instruments, but they will use 3D pens and a 3 D printer to invent and make instrument of their own!

Fairytales Come to Life – S Cockrell, K-2: Fictional fairy tales brought to life as we dive into a new story each day through hands-on creative STEAM activities (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math)

Sculpt-a-Story – Amanda Warren, K-4: Campers will enjoy a fun filled week combining creative storytelling and 3D art projects. Each day will focus on a well known story as the basis for a different sculpture project. Campers will use air dry clay, foam, Super Sculpty and more to bring stories to life!

Piñatas & More – J. Mark Garrett 2-4: Mexican art is so bright, colorful, and fun! We will make piñatas, molas, amate, yarn art, sun faces, and more. Every day you will get to take home an original piece of awesome art.

Breakout- Shannon Carlisle/Kelia Glenn, 2-4: The Breakout Box game is similar to challenges offered at the escape room location in Tupelo, except campers will be given a themed scenario including a story and purpose for breaking into boxes! The Breakout Box incorporate a collection of locks, hidden contraptions, times, keys, diversion hardware, and rewards that are used to play the game. Campers will have a fixed amount of time to solve a series of challenges, riddles, and mysteries in order to "Break Out!"

Mad Scientists! - Dedra Wray, 2-4 Grab your lab coat and safety goggles and channel your inner Mad Scientist! You will be transformed into a real scientist as we explore the world of bubbling chemical reactions, oozing slime, kinetic conservation, and rocket building!

1-2-3 Come Cook with Me! – Rachel Davis, 3-7: Come spend a week cooking a variety of recipes each day, taking home samples to share! We will mix, bake, boil, sauté and more! During the week we will photograph our delectable foods and create cookbooks for each participant to take home at the end of the week.

Camp Collage- Madi Martin West, 3-7: Are you tired of simply drawing or painting your artwork? Well this camp is all about the art of collage. We will layer up different materials to make unique and beautiful works of art. You just come and we'll provide the scissors and glue!

June 25-29

Royalty Reigns! – Theresa Winter, K-2: Hear Ye! Hear Ye! Calling all princes and princesses! You are cordially invited to join us in celebrating all things royal! In this camp, we will explore what it means to have true nobility. We will use creative thinking, prince and princess style! We will construct our own castles and build catapults to protect them from the fire-breathing dragon. Our princes will design their own royal shield, while the princess designs her royal scepter. And of course no prince or princess would be complete without their own royal attire (designed and created from newsprint) or a crown of their own! So let your royal creative juices flow and join us for the camp of kingship!

Little Einsteins – Anne M. Littrell, K-2: We are going on a trip in our favorite rocket ship. Join us for 5 days of science exploration in the areas of earth science, life science, physical science, art and STEM. Wear old clothes since this camp is messy, wet and fun!

Survival of the Talented, Celeste Ellis, 2-4: Can you make a room with paper? Which boat holds the most weight? Can you make a car that moves? This camp will provide a week full of science engineering challenges. Students will participate in an ongoing project that will take 3-4 days to complete. Each child will be building and creating architecture and modes of transportation. They will be challenged based on strength, speed, and stamina. They will compete in teams and individually in a variety of challenges.

Elo England- Madi Martin, 2-4: Cheerio! Join us for a cuppa tea and maybe even a jammy dodger. We'll have a brilliant time learning all about jolly old England, its food, history, art and much, much more! We'd be chuffed to have ya!

BAM! POW! Comic Book Camp – Amanda Warren, 2-4: Campers will spend the week learning about their favorite super heroes, beyond the block buster movies. The origin and history of Superman, Batman, Wonder Woman, The Avengers and others will be discussed while students are able to view and read a selection of Bronze and Modern Age comic books. Campers will even get the chance to create their own hero. Lessons will include creative writing as well as an introduction to figure drawing and basics of ink and color.

Theatre: Scripted & Improv – Marley Maharrey, 3-7: Students will learn how to portray scripted characters onstage, how to create a set and how to improvise scenes. The camp will benefit growth in public speaking, cooperation, critical thinking and collaboration.
