Dear Parents and Community Members,

For the 2012-13 school year, SHS received an overall state rating of Level Three (below the state average.)

Academic Highlights:

1. Reading Scores increased 17.5% from 2011-12.
2. 2012-13, 88.4% of our students passed the OAKS Reading Test!
3. Graduation Rate is 80%, above the state average!
4. Math scores increased 7.3% from 2011-12!
5. Participation rate for OAKS testing is 99%!

While we continue to focus on reading, there are two areas we need to improve: math and writing. We will use our PLC time to focus on best practices in math and writing. Senior writing will be

offered for students needing extra support. Two years ago Oregon began phasing in graduation requirements that include demonstrating proficiency on reading, writing and math OAKS assessments. You can help by monitoring your student's homework, attending parent-teacher conferences, or volunteering. You can review your student's assignments and grades at any time by visiting our school website. We look forward to partnering with you over the coming year to make sure all of our students reach their potential.

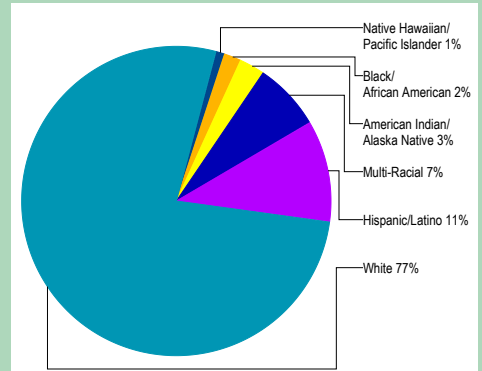

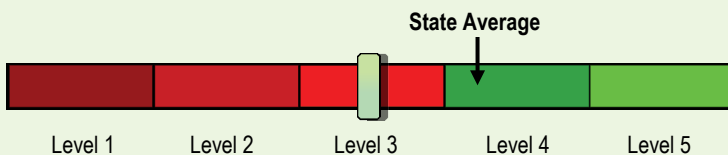

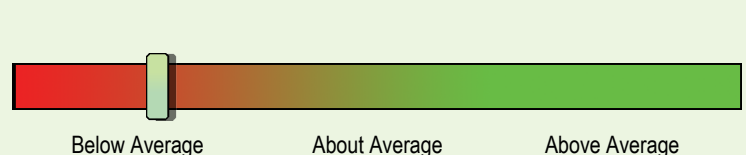
The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. High schools are also rated on the overall graduation rate for the school and the graduation rates of underserved subgroups. Please be aware that this rating is based mainly on high-stakes testing and accordingly, represents a limited view of student performance. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2012-13, this school is rated as Level 3.



- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
- Level 2** = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
- Level 3** = Falls between 15% and 44% of schools
- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
- Level 5** = Falls into the top 10% of schools
