Hello families,

Hope this finds you all healthy & enjoying the spring weather!

Here is a quick update from OHA/ODE.

A five-day period of isolation for those infected with COVID-19 will also **no longer be recommended** for the general population, including people in K-12 education settings for the rest of this school year and the opening of the next school year. The recommendation for covid falls in line with all respiratory illnesses:

- to stay home until fever free for 24 hours, cough is well controlled and symptoms are improving;
- to avoid contact with individuals at increased risk for severe disease, including older adults and those with underlying medical conditions;
- and to consider masking for 10 days.

A communicable disease management plan will still need to be in place for the next school year for each school. This will be posted on the district website before school starts.

We made it! Another year in the books. It has been an absolute joy working with your children this year, helping them foster growth in their social emotional skills.



As we head into summer I'd like to share some ideas to continue your child's social emotional learning...

- Mindfulness has been practiced daily with our school wide morning breathing practice. I encourage you to practice this with your students at home this summer. The more they practice the more automatic the mindfulness response becomes. [MindYeti](#) is a great resource for PreK - 3rd grade. It was created by the Committee for Children who is the creator of Second Step, one of the SEL curriculum used at NES. [Waterford.org](#) is another great resource for kids and mindfulness as well. Additionally, The [Child Mind Institute](#) is a great resource in learning more about supporting your children's mental health.
- Supporting children during big emotions is crucial in building their emotional intelligence. As adults, modeling for them the recognition of our own feelings and tools to work through them is so beneficial. for kids. Below is a script as a starting point to help your kiddos work through big emotions:

BIG EMOTION COACHING

1. ACKNOWLEDGE THE EMOTION Let the Child know that you see they are experiencing an emotion	SAY: I can see something is bothering you.
2. LABEL THE EMOTION Help the child understand what emotion they may be feeling	SAY: where is your energy level? Are you feeling comfortable or uncomfortable?
3. VALIDATE THE EMOTION All emotions are valid even if the emotion doesn't fit the problem	SAY: It sounds like you feel _____ because of _____. Does that sound right?
Help your child problem solve	
SADNESS needs comfort	SAY: It's ok to cry, do you want a hug?
ANGER needs patience	SAY: I'm going to wait over here until you are ready.
ANXIETY needs security	SAY: You're safe, I'm here for you. Tell me about it.

Youth Center News – Summer!!

If you're in need of childcare visit the Welcome Center at NCRD or call 855-444-6273. On school days we pick up your students at Nehalem Elementary school at the end of each school day and are open until 5pm. Cost is \$6 a day per child, and this includes a nutritious snack and a host of enrichment activities (outdoor play/walks, gym time, crafts, music, science, and etc...). We are closed for all national holiday's and on day's observing the holiday. This month's Holiday is Juneteenth. We have changed the way we charge and bill in the Youth Department. Prices are as follows:

\$20 pre-registration and pre-payment.

\$25 Day of registration (space permitting) with payment.

\$30 Day of registration (space permitting) with invoice billing.

This month the last day of school is Thursday June 15th, this will be an early release day (School is out at Noon!!) We will pick the kids up directly after school and have a fun last day activities planned. On June 16th summer hours at the youth center begin, they are 7am – 5pm. We provide breakfast, lunch, and a snack. We plan to visit Aldercreek Farm, the Bookmobile will be here every other Tuesday, and Field Trip Wednesday's start in July, get registered as they fill fast.
