That initial act of generosity quickly turned into Dave helping Mr. MC build an entire set of robotics tables for his classroom—setting the tone for the next five years of unwavering support.

Since then, Dave has become the parent we can count on for just about anything. He has taken on heavy jobs, such as moving rocks and gravel and painting steppingstones for our campus beautification project. He has also tackled countless behind-the-scenes tasks—sorting through tens of thousands of LEGO pieces and organizing kits for classroom robotics lessons and our First LEGO League teams.

To put his dedication in perspective: Dave has probably handled more tiny LEGO pieces than most people see in a lifetime. I am fairly certain that if he stepped on a LEGO in the middle of the night, he wouldn't even yell—he would simply tell you the exact part number and which kit it belongs to before turning on the light.

If you have ever walked into the Robotics room at Ventana Vista and seen perfectly laid-out robotics mats or complex models ready for instruction, there is a very good chance Dave played a role in making that happen. He regularly steps into robotics classes to support students whenever other volunteers are unavailable. Over the years, Dave has saved Mr. MC literally hundreds of hours of work by taking responsibility for building, sorting, and organizing materials. This allows the teacher to focus more fully on instruction, resulting in deeper learning for our students.


