Supporting Bobcats Through Mock STAAR Preparation

In preparation for the upcoming Mock STAAR assessments, our special education team is actively engaged in both resource classrooms and general education settings. Through intentional co-teaching and strategic partnerships, we are ensuring that students with disabilities receive the scaffolding and accommodations they need to demonstrate their learning and build confidence ahead of state testing.



TRAX Sessions and Targeted Instruction

Our Career TRAX sessions remain a cornerstone of our academic intervention efforts. High school students preparing for EOC retests are receiving focused instruction aligned to their individual needs, while elementary and middle school students are participating in small group sessions that emphasize foundational TEKS. These sessions are specifically designed to address learning gaps and support students with disabilities in mastering critical content. In addition to TRAX, we have launched STAAR Boot Camps to provide wraparound academic support, reinforcing key concepts

and test-taking strategies. These efforts reflect our commitment to ensuring every Bobcat is STAAR ready.

Campus Collaboration and Inclusive Practices

We are also proud to highlight the exceptional collaboration taking place across campuses. Our special education staff and general education partners are working hand-in-hand to create inclusive learning environments that prioritize student growth and success. 2101 Credit Recovery courses completed 8/18 through 10/31. That is 1050.5 credits!!
