## Organizing & Planning Your Year

#### **Book Curriculum:**

- Check to make sure you have all parts of the curriculum. Reach out to your Contact teacher if anything is missing.
- If you have more than one student, divide it up into piles. If there are a few subjects your student share, have a separate pile for that curriculum.

How to Organize it:

- See how many total lessons/tests are in the year for each subject. You can do this by checking the Table of Contents in most books.
- Divide that by how many weeks you are planning to homeschool (36 is average). This will give you an idea of how many lessons/tests you need to get through each week to complete the year's worth of work.

Write down the expectations:

- Make sure to write down daily, weekly, monthly for what is expected during the year for completion of each class. This way your student(s) should know where they need to be and what needs to be accomplished to complete each class.
- Check in with your student(s) on a weekly basis to make sure they stay on track and don't fall too far behind. It is difficult to catch up if you fall too far behind

#### **Online Curriculum:**

- Login to your parent portal and familiarize yourself with the basic layout of the site and the tutorials.
  - Check through the classes and see how many assignments/tests there are for each class. Divide that by how many weeks you are planning to homeschool (36 is average). This will give you an idea of how many lessons/tests your student(s) needs to get through each week to complete the year's worth of work.
- Login to your student(s) account, if separate. Look through the layout of the site with your student(s) to find lessons, assignments, & due dates. You may need to go through the first lessons to help them get comfortable with the program.
- Make sure to:
- login daily, weekly at the least, to make sure progress is being made
- check scores on work as they go in case they need more work on a skill or need to repeat a chapter to understand the material
- and check your student(s) are staying on the schedule to complete the class on time. (This will save you stress at the ends of each semester.)

If you want to get some help with your curriculum, we will be having parent drop-in days in the Anchorage Learning Center for curriculum organization in August and September. Watch for a flyer in your email if you want to get some guided help organizing your curriculum and your school year.

<u>Remember</u>: This may be new for both you and your child. It takes practice, a willingness to try new things, and patience to create a successful routine for you all. The more time you invest planning and preparing at the beginning and establishing a routine and expectations, the easier your year will be for you all.

Please reach out to your contact teacher with any questions or concerns you may have as you get started.
