# Behavior and Discipline

## Behavior Incidents - Summary

JTHS District 204

- Significant increase in Tardy referrals (4,393)
- Increased focus on Truancy/Partial Day absences resulted in increase in referrals (716)
- Decrease in referrals for disruptive behaviors
  - 2023-2024: Hall/Class Conduct & Disrespect 3,267
  - 2024-2025: Classroom Conduct, Hallway Conduct, & Noncompliance 2,949
- Severe Infractions
  - School data flipped from last year; Increases at West, Decreases at Central
  - Substance Use referrals are down
  - 48% of severe incidents occur in Hallways or Restrooms

## **Detention Summary**



- Use of Detention increased at Central and decreased at West due to the loss of a detention room at West around Spring Break due to construction
- Primarily used for Tardies and less severe/disruptive behaviors
- Students continue to be served lunch in detention
- Completion monitored using the Infinite Campus Detention Tracker

### **ISS Summary**



- ISS continues to be a structured full day of activities
- Allocated Two (2) staff members with a Substitute Teaching License
- Usage of ISS increased due to increase in referrals
- West Campus combined into a shared space with Detention at Spring Break due to construction

## OSS Summary



- Changes in incidences and days of OSS mirror Severe Incidents at both campuses
  - Central Decrease
  - West Increase
- Race, IEP Status, and Income Status continue to be indicators of increased risk of severe behaviors and suspensions

## Behavior/Discipline Changes 2025-2026

- Implement Student Support Table each day
- First Year of Levelled Behavior Infractions (Strategic Plan 1.5)
- Full implementation of Infinite Campus Hall Pass system
  - Additional Scanners purchased for Administrators and Deans
  - Goal to improve interactions between staff and students in hallways by minimizing opportunities for miscommunication
- Classroom Doors locked after the tardy bell (Pilot at West Campus)
  - Students will need a pass to enter class late
  - Hand scanners will help with monitoring
- Explore additional alternative programming for students with an IEP
  - Strategies 1.5 & 2.2 of Strategic Plan

#### Truants Alternative and Optional Educational Program (TAOEP)/Alternative Learning Opportunities Program 2024 - 2025

- 18 students referred to Lincoln
  - Central 9 students
  - West 9 students
- There was a zero percent increase of students recommended to the TAOEP Program from the 23-24 school year.

#### Transition Process Students Returning to JTHS from Lincoln



- Director of Equity and Strategic Partnerships, Dean, JTHS Counselor, Lincoln School Counselor, Parent, & Student
- Review student performance at Lincoln
- JTHS counselors provide a preliminary schedule based on the student's needs.
- SEL/BHT Supports are discussed
- Parents and students identify needs and other possible accommodations
- Registration information is given to families
- Opportunity to participate in Problem-Solving Circles

## Problem-Solving Circles



- 343 students were placed on behavior warning
  - $\circ$  246 referrals were received for problem solving circles
  - $\circ$  209 families participated in the process
    - 154 families out of 209 successfully completed the PSC process. (74% success rate)
    - Out of the 209 total families
      - 77 were referred by Joliet Central Deans (37%),
      - 132 were referred by Joliet West Deans (63%).

(Note: Referrals from Pathways are absorbed in the numbers from Joliet West and Joliet Central).

• 51 families out of 209 began the PSC process and did not complete the program due to disqualification for not completing the process and not responding to various communication attempts. (24% failure rate)

#### Three Day Assignment

Student and Parent must agree to the intervention

Student must admit that their actions were wrong Re-entry agreement created by student before returning to classes Students must agree to participate in 8-week group process

## Catalyst Program



#### Summary 2024-2025

- 2024-2025 was year three (3) of the Catalyst program
- Referrals and demographics mirror severe incidents
- Administrators made follow-up calls when a family refused Catalyst
  - Joliet Central ~28% of eligible students refused
  - Joliet West ~13% of eligible students refused

#### Updates for Next Year

- Continue to provide follow up communication to minimize program refusals
- Increase push-in support from student Triangle Teams

## Student Support Groups



#### Summary 24-25

- Tracking student progress in Panorama.
- Updated group information/criteria for every student group.

#### Updates for Next Year

• Exploring ways in ensure every student completes a Pre and Post survey on their experience in group using Panorama.

## Cool Down Room



- Cool Down Room specialist has taken on an increasing number of responsibilities within the school including...
  - Point person of communication for PPS Services and Staff.
  - Providing and organizing McKinney Vento Support and Resources throughout the school and community.
  - Threat Assessment Team Member.
  - Hospital Liaison between area mental health hospitals and support staff.





- Use of IRIS online system to make referrals to Thriveworks for PPS Staff.
- 58 Referrals completed by IRIS.
- Continue use of IRIS to make referrals to Thriveworks.

### Substance Abuse Interventions



#### Summary 2024-2025

- Added Community Partner BELA Recovery.
- Completed Tier 1 Freshman Presentations (Prevention Education)
- Added Will County Substance Abuse Counselor for individual support.

#### Updates for Next Year

- Expanding prevention education especially to our younger high school students.
- New Grant Funding to expand on professional development and tier 1 prevention education (\$5,000 per school, each semester)

## Behavioral Health Teams



#### Summary 2024-2025

- Similar number of Referrals as recent years
- Addition of WCHD Substance Use Department
- Loss of Joliet Township Government Counseling midyear
- Increase in screening paperwork at West to match Central

#### Adjustments 2025-2026

- Continue with referrals from Triangle Teams to BHT
- Increase communication/collaboration with Community Partners
- Explore additional programming to support student needs

### Home Visits



- Continued usage due to Chronic Absenteeism with families not responsive to phone calls and e-mails.
- Will continue to use to collect signatures.
- Best Practice training conducted annually.

Updates 25-26:

- Review staffing and assignments of how Home Visits are assigned (equity).
- Continue to brainstorm ways to expand on usage. (McKinney-Vento families)

# Problem Solving Circles



- Out of the 209 families, 110 were Black (53%), 82 were Hispanic (39%), 14 were White (7%), 5 were other (2.4%).
- Out of the 209 families, 137 were male (66%) and 71 were female (34%).
- Out of the 137 males, 65 were Black (47%), 62 were Hispanic (45%), 9 were White (7%).
- Out of the 72 females 45 were Black (63%), 20 were Hispanic (28%), 5 were White (7%) and 1 Asian female student (1%).
- Out of the 209 families, 71 were Freshman (34%), 63 were Sophomores (30%), 49 were Juniors (23%), and 26 were Seniors (11%).
- Number of Dean referrals based on 209 families who participated in 2024-2025: Franchini 31, Fears 16, Boyter 17, Reed 17, Contreras 23, Kosiek 12, Lincoln 17, Laken 5, Carbine 16, Thompson 26, Chally 29, and Rumpf 21.
- Out of the 209 families, the related severe behaviors were as follows: 107 fights (51%), 43 batteries (21%), 32 substance abuse (15%), 5 thefts (2%), 7 assault (3%), 6 weapons (3%), 7 Instigation (3%), 2 chronic attendance (1%), 3 student violence (2%), and 1 Chronic Attendance (0.5%).
- Of the 209 families participating this year an estimated 8 students remained or were placed back on behavior warning (4%) for committing another severe infraction, dropping from school, transferring, or relocating.
