Overall, teachers are fairly happy with the results of this grading period with the exception of 6th grade. We would like to have those numbers drop and are continually working on making that happen. It has been beneficial to students to have an additional teacher this year and we are starting to see some of the progress kids are making as a result. We have one 5th grader who was referred to the COSSA Emotionally Disturbed program, one 6th grader who has missed over 20 days of school, two 6th graders who are in the process of meeting special education requirements and two 7th graders who are being referred to COSSA for failing last year and this year. These placements will help kids become more successful in school.

We are always working to motivate students to earn their way on the honor roll. We feel good that 65% of the building has A and B grades but will continue pushing others to improve. Students were honored with certificates in an awards assembly.

Educational Effectiveness Survey

All students took a school survey to identify how our school is doing in the following areas: Collaboration and Communication, Clear and Shared Focus, High Standards and Expectations, Effective Leadership, Supportive Learning Environment, Parent and Community Involvement, and Monitoring of Teaching and Learning.

Overall, the school was rated higher in comparison to the top 5% of highest improving schools at our grade level. The area we scored the highest was for having **high standards and expectations** as perceived by students. The area we need to improve upon is **parent and community involvement**. This was not a surprise as we have been working to improve in this area for the last couple of years. We struggle to get parents involved in the school after 5th grade but will continue to work in this area.

Book Fair

HMS received \$545 from our fall book fair. The librarian will be using that money to purchase new books for the library.
