This has been a great year for the Theatre Department in regards to student's accomplishments and Fall Show and UIL One-Act Play/Jr. High One-Act Play Performances, and Drama Club. This year our Fall Show was The House of Dracula, and this was a show with more than 40 students involved in on both the acting and technical side of Theatre. The students worked together and created an amazing show that the audiences enjoyed. Technical students got to build the inside and outside of a castle, and create lighting/sound to aide in communicating the play to the audience. The actors got to incorporate traditional acting and improvisational theatre in the same setting to create wonderful characters and an amazing production. The students really enjoyed this show and it showed in their performances. Then we move onto this year's Jr. High One-Act Play, which was put on by a group of dedicated students that took pride in their work and it showed. This year's Jr. High UIL One-Act Play was The Ash Girl, based on the Cinderella Story, and is about how people in general, are in a constant struggle of making good and bad decisions and in this interpretation the motivators of these decisions are the 7 Deadly Sins in animal form and on the opposite side of the spectrum are animals that represent good. These animals are characters in the play and add the magical element to the play. The students did a great job on the technical side and acting side in communicating the message and they all grew as actors, technicians, and as an ensemble. These students had an amazing performance and came away with All-Star Cast: Mallory Boyer and Honorable Mention All-Star Cast: Taylor Freeman. I was very excited to work with this group of students and very proud of them all. Next was the High School UIL One-Act Play. This year One-Act Play was, Afterlife: A Ghost Story. This from the beginning had been one of the more difficult productions that these students have done. This play deals with a grief stricken family that has lost a child and how they cope with it in the present and in the Afterlife. I was happy to see such dedicated students jump on board with this emotional rollercoaster of a play. The students took the material seriously and made it their own. They were dedicated, driven, and a family throughout the entirety of this show. With this type of show it is very difficult for students to sometimes connect, relate, and communicate the message of this play to the audience, and these students did just that. They had an amazing performance that brought the audience to tears. You know a performance has gone well, when the students involved are proud of their work. The students made Alternate at District and took home many Acting Awards. These acting awards included: All-Star Cast: Tarissa Ensminger as DANIELLE, Brennan Davis as BLACK BIRD, Honorable Mention All-Star Cast: Joseph Bettis as CONNOR, David Borella as YOUNG MAN, Caitlyn Denning as SEAMSTRESS All-Star

Crew: Luke Hartman for STAGEHAND. These students did a great job and I could not have asked for a better performance from them. They are dedicated to their craft and it shows. Also this year the Drama Club has been continuing to grow and students are finding new outlets for theatre and come together for interests alike, including: Play Writing, Play Reading, Designing and many more. Also the Improv Troupe has been working very hard this year creating well-established characters and working long-form improvisation scenes. This has been a fantastic year over all and I am very proud of all of them and their accomplishments as a whole and individually. This year we also will have our Advanced Theatre class's Children Play, in which they write their own play this year and it will be performed towards the end of the year at both elementaries. They have worked very hard on this project and it is great to see a group of dedicated students come together and create a great piece of Theatre from start to finish on their own. This has been a great year over-all and we look forward to next year.

# <u>Science – Mrs. Wimbrough</u>

Pre-AP Biology: They are currently doing and autopsy on a Picklus domesticus (pickle) to determine the cause and manner of death. This is their introductory to the animal unit. During this unit they will perform comparative dissection on a worm, bull frog and fetal pig. At the end they will prepare a dissection booklet that compares and contrasts the systems in the three animals.

Biology: They are currently working on the plant unit. They are performing an experiment where they compare the effects of different levels of light on the growth of three plants.

A&P: They are finishing the unit on the immune system and beginning the Respiratory system unit. They will finish the unit with a dissection of a mink. During this dissection they will review all of the body systems that they have covered so far this year.

Physics:

The physics classes are currently studying electricity and will be assembling an 'electric house' and then calculating the current, voltage and resistance in them.

#### Hulsey

Biology: Studying plant structure and function while experimenting the effect of light as a variable for plant growth.

Pre-AP Chemistry: Studying pH and pOH to understand the components of bases and acids to experiment with neutralization reactions in the laboratory.

Environmental Science: Learning about water as an environmental and human health resource and how to approach the water crisis with sustainability and quality as a priority.

Color Guard: Competed in Winter Guard and earned a 5th place finish in our class, and round. The guard was moved up from Novice class to Regional A three weeks before the championships!! Being promoted is very good, but tough to compete when you get promoted just before Championships.

Percussion: The percussion placed 5th in their Championship round as well. They had an amazing show and worked very hard to compete in a new activity. This was part of the North Texas Colorguard Association.

UIL Solo and Ensemble. We had the best results AHS has ever have ever had for a spring semester!! The band has certified 64 students to the State Solo and Ensemble Contest in Austin, in May.
