Goals

Academic Goals

- By the end of the 2016-2017 school year, the percentage of all students who are on track to graduate will be 90% as evidenced by credit attainment
- By the end of the 2016-2017 school year, Jefferson High School will have a graduation rate of 92% as evidenced by the percentage of students graduating.
- By the end of the 2016-2017 school year, 40% of all students taking math ISTEP will pass and 60% of all students taking the ISTE ELA will pass.

Attendance Goals

- At the end of each quarter, 9th grade student tardies will decrease by 10% as evidenced by data collected in PowerSchool.
- By the end of the 2016-2017 school year, JHS will reduce truancies by 2% as evidenced by attendance data.

Climate/Culture Goal

• By the end of the 2016-2017 school year, JHS will have increased success in providing a respectful school environment as evidenced by fewer discipline referrals for disrespectful behaviors towards adults and other students.

- Implementing high impact reading, writing, speaking and listening standards and strategies so all JHS students graduate college, career, and community ready
- Shifting instructional practice from teacher centered to student centered through 1:1 integration that encourages students to take control of their own learning
- Supporting teacher teams to collaborate around standards-based instruction and assessment so all students can become critical readers, writers and collaborators who are ready for college and/or career
