Background Information:		e 2025-26 school year and first conducted a comprehensi		

instrument inventory and assignments for both the high school and junior high programs. During the 2024-25 school year, the district made significant investments in the band program including uniforms and several marching band specific instruments.

Historically, a substantial portion of instruments and equipment has been shared between the high school and junior high due to both programs operating in the same facility. Larger instruments were often rotated between class period and some essential supplies were designated as "program-wide" without clear campus-specific allocation.

With the upcoming high school campus relocation, this practice of sharing instruments and supplies will no longer be feasible. To ensure equitable access to instruments and to maintain the quality and continuity of instruction for both campuses, it is necessary to purchase additional instruments and equipment designated specifically for each location.

Quotes were obtained from three different vendors under various purchasing cooperatives. The detailed price quotes are attached.

Based upon a review of the quotes, it was determined that the best value for the district would be obtained by purchasing from the following vendors.

HS Music Service (Region 20): \$149,249.08 Steve Weiss Music (Buyboard): \$9,220.90 Music & Arts (Buyboard): \$2,851.40 Total: \$161,321.38

The instruments will be purchased with bond FF&E funds.
