



# East Aurora Extension Campus School Improvement Presentation April 15, 2024

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# **2022-2023 Summary**

- 62% of English Language Learners demonstrated growth as measured by ACCESS
- 57% of students met or exceeded their growth target in MATH as measured by NWEA MAP
- 20 EAEC students graduated in the Class of 2023
- Average Daily Attendance for the 22-23 school year was 72.13%

#### **Student Attendance**

By the end of the school year, EAEC will maintain an average daily attendance percentage of at least 75%.

- Daily calls to parents by parent liaison
- SLT compares year to date attendance data at each meeting
- Administration pulls weekly attendance reports to monitor student attendance and determine appropriate steps / interventions
- ROE truancy referrals made for chronically truant students
- Administrators provide incentives for students with improved attendance

## **Student Behavior**

By the end of the school year, EAEC will reduce the percentage of students receiving multiple behavioral referrals when compared to the 2022-2023 school year, with an explicit focus on those students with five or more referrals.

- Administration monitors student referrals focusing on students who have received two or more referrals
- Administration analyzes behavioral data to facilitate targeted discussions with all stakeholders regarding student behaviors
- Administration monitors student referrals with a focus on students issued referrals for not following directives

## **Student Achievement**

By the end of the school year, 60% of EAEC students will meet or exceed their expected growth target in both Reading and Math as measured by the NWEA MAP assessment.

- Teachers analyze student data to identify specific instructional needs
- Students engage in goal setting as part of their learning process
- Data conversations during PLC to assess and identify efficacy and efficiency of learning strategies
- Incentives provided for students meeting / exceeding expected growth



## **Student Achievement**

By the end of the end of the school year, EAEC will increase the number of students who are "on track" to graduate by 5% when compared to the 2022-2023 school year as measured by the total number of credits earned.

- Goal setting meetings held with High School students to establish semester and yearly goals
- Weekly analysis of student grades and progress towards course completion
- Parent- student- administration meetings regarding academic progress
- Incentives provided for credit acquisition
