



An evidence-based, interdisciplinary pediatric primary care program that promotes nurturing parenting and healthy development for babies and toddlers, particularly in areas where there have been persistent inequities for families of color or with low incomes.

HealthySteps Specialists are integrated into the pediatric team to provide short-term behavior/development consultation and referrals, intensive services when needed, and support practice screening efforts.





Pediatric Setting

ACCESS

Almost all families take their babies to see a pediatric primary care provider

TRUST

Parents trust their pediatric primary care provider

ACCEPTED

The pediatric office is a non-stigmatizing setting

FREQUENT

New parents attend 12-13 wellchild visits within the first 3 years of life; half occur in the first year



Practice and Provider Impacts

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- ✓ Parents more satisfied with their care
- ✓ Physicians highly satisfied
- ✓ Equitable care
- ✓ Lower costs

INCREASED PATIENT SATISFACTION

- Families were significantly more likely to report practice staff went out of the way for them, that they relied on practice staff for advice (rather than a friend or relative) and that they received needed emotional support^{1,22}
- Families rated their provider as more competent and caring and were significantly more likely to believe that the health plan cared about them and to recommend their clinic to a friend or family member^{6,22}

INCREASED PROVIDER SATISFACTION

- Physicians reported significantly higher satisfaction with HealthySteps and that they
 felt emotionally supported by the HealthySteps Specialist^{1,25}
- Physicians were over 5x more likely to be very satisfied with the ability of clinical staff to meet children's developmental and behavioral needs¹

MORE EQUITABLE CARE

• One HealthySteps site with integrated behavioral care found that families received equitable advice regardless of race, ethnicity, or language, suggesting that HealthySteps can help mitigate existing disparities in the quality of pediatric primary care²⁷

LOWER COSTS

 One HealthySteps site serving a diverse pediatric population found that estimated costs averted exceeded program operating costs (\$641-\$959 compared to \$575 per child)²⁸

HealthySteps positively affects both children and their families. Many of the outcomes listed below were demonstrated in a large national evaluation, whereas others were indicated in local evaluations or other published research. KEY OUTCOMES

(for families receiving Tier 2 & Tier 3 services)

Short-Term (<1 year)

CHILD HEALTH

- · Greater adherence to well-child visits
- Increased vaccination rates
- Earlier identification & treatment of child concerns
- · Increased breastfeeding & age-appropriate nutrition
- · Earlier adoption of preventive dental hygiene

PARENTING KNOWLEDGE & PRACTICES

- · Increased understanding of child development & behavior
- · Increased use of positive parenting approaches
- · Increased child safety practices
- · Decreased use of harsh & severe discipline
- Increased behaviors/activities that enhance child development & early learning

FAMILY HEALTH & WELL-BEING

- · Increased use of available services to address family needs
- · Greater maternal adherence to postpartum check-up
- · Reduction in unmet caregiver healthcare needs

Intermediate (1-3 years)

CHILD & FAMILY WELL-BEING

TIER 1 UNIVERSAL SCREENING

- 4,904 children received at least one developmental screening; 48.3% screened with at least one concern
- 5,473 children received at least one social-emotional screening; 24.6% screened with concern
- 3,455 children were screened for Autism; 27.4% screened with concern
- 3,720 families were screened for SDOH
- 3,050 mothers were screened for maternal depression

TIER 2 SHORT TERM SUPPORT

 350 families were provided one on one intervention for developmental or behavior concerns

TIER 3 ONGOING, PREVENTATIVE TEAM-BASED WELL CHILD VISITS

3,087 children received team-based well child visits
