Instructional Coaches

We are off to a great start of the new school year! We have welcomed new and returning students to our wonderful school! It's always great to see new faces who are eager to begin learning in the first month of school! Both coaches have jumped right in with assessing our new fourth grade students for placement in our phonics intervention program. Together with the interventionist, we have almost completed phonics placements as well as assessing all new fifth grade students. Mrs. Bragg completed a PD with the Specialist using the new phonics assessment for Phonics for Reading that was added to our Strategic plan this past summer. The math screening plan is well underway with a schedule for implementation of the math intervention groups for the end of August and early September. 5th grade students will be placed based on last spring Aimsweb data, and all fourth grade students will be placed once they are giving the fall benchmark assessment using Aimsweb. The coaches currently have 2 active coaching cycles occurring, with regular cycles beginning the first week in September. The walkthrough schedule has been determined to date and will begin full time in the beginning of September.

Counseling Center

Greetings from the Napi Counseling. The year is off to a great start and we have been extremely busy getting students school supplies, assigning lockers and getting students back to school to start the new year.

This year, I will be using the Second Step Curriculum with all students in my Character Education Specials Class to teach empathy, emotional management and problem solving skills for all students in grades 4 and 5. These classes have already started and the new 4th graders are enjoying Character Education Class and working really hard.

Supportive Services are also ready to begin. These services include; Dessa Small Groups, Tamarack Grief Groups, Clothing Closet, Youth Dynamics Case Management and weekend food program for students that would benefit. It is the goal of the Counseling Center to be an on-stop location to remove barriers to student academic success.

Spookinaapi Project

The month of August has been enjoyable returning back to school and getting back into the routine of things. As the Spokinaapi Prevention Specialist at Napi Elementary, it is my goal to include the various objectives required by the grant to provide substance abuse prevention curriculum during specials. The name of the curriculum that will be provided during specials is called Too Good for

Drugs, with lessons that primarily focus on Healthy Decision-making skills. Aside from the curriculum, Spokinaapi specials focus a lot on improving self-esteem, positive self-talk, and positive social interactions. It's a great opportunity to work with elementary age students as it instills a great foundation of confidence and navigating choices, ultimately preparing them for junior high.

Upon returning to school from summer break and welcoming a new set of 4th grade students the focus for Spokinaapi specials this month has been introducing and defining self-esteem. Starting the year by focusing on positive self-talk, being kind to self, and giving positive compliments to others. When students were asked to raise their hand if they received a compliment from another student on that day it was average that only 1 student raised their hand per class. As we move forward in the next month, students have agreed they would like to work towards giving each other more compliments.

Spokinaapi also helps greet students in the morning, utilize the FIT resource by providing shoes or clothes to students in need, Check-in and connect, Dessa small groups (no groups in August), and provide Lunch support groups during both grade levels.
