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INTRODUCTION







We fully understand the purpose of a charter school as an incubator for educational ideas.

We want to share with you some of the ideas we use that make Haas Hall Academy such an effective and efficient school.

- Academics are first and foremost and rewarded with days named after scholars who do extraordinary things.
- We seek faculty having advanced degrees and previous work experience in their respective fields.
- Scholars at Haas Hall Academy carry four 90-minute courses a day. These courses are completed by the semester, not by the calendar year. Doing this provides an added 3.2 hours of instruction each week compared with a typical school day. We achieve one additional Carnegie unit class doing it this way.
- We offer a free full and inclusive tutoring program four days a week on each of our campuses. For scholars scoring below a C in any course, we require attendance at these tutoring programs.
- Scholars take the ACT and/or SAT a minimum of one time a year beginning in the 9th grade and take review courses throughout the year on test taking skills.
- Scholars are required to take the PSAT each year in grades 7-11. We collectively review the longitudinal data to confirm our curriculum is exceeding our expectations.
- We require faculty to review longitudinal AP and ACT Aspire scores each year. Department Heads are required to submit action plans for improvement or areas for increased focus in the classroom.
- Scholars at Haas Hall Academy take courses by academic ability, not by grade level, thus ensuring that a scholar's academic schedule meets his/her academic needs and abilities. The only exception is English, where scholars take one year of literature and one year of composition each calendar year.
- Haas Hall Academy personalizes a scholar's academic program to meet the needs of their intended college major. For example, at Haas Hall Academy if a scholar's intended major is engineering, he/she will enter college prepared to take Calculus III.
- · Haas Hall Academy incorporates uniforms for safety and unity.

Our plan from the beginning was to provide a holistic approach to nutrition by providing our scholars with fresh, vibrant, farm to table ingredients prepared daily by trained culinary professionals.

Our chefs chop fresh vegetables, bake warm breads, and grill proteins daily. Our chefs have introduced scholars to a wide array of vegetables and proteins they had not eaten at home. They do ethnic food days, and always provide our scholars with vegetarian options.



In the fall of 2018, we began providing our scholars with fresh, warm breakfast items. Many of our scholars have said they cannot wait to get to school to enjoy a fresh homemade breakfast by our culinary chefs. It is our hope that we will be able to use the Kitchen at the Lane to provide breakfast and lunch to our other campuses in Northwest Arkansas.

SPRINGDALE

Scholars and faculty at Haas Hall Academy @ The Jones Center have a heart for service and they are acutely aware of the needs of others — in the Springdale community itself as well as fellow scholars.

They have been involved in numerous projects to offer basic humans needs to people in the city, including keeping the LIttle Free Pantry at The Jones Center stocked with food items.



CITY OF BENTONVILLE/BENTON COUNTY



The Art Club at Haas Hall Academy Bentonville was commissioned to create an impressive, wall-sized mural to be displayed indefinitely at the Benton County Revenue Office.

The Haas Hall Academy Bentonville campus has participated in numerous community activities during the first portion of the 2018-19 academic year. Scholars from Green Team adopted 18th Street through the City of Bentonville's Adopt-A-Street program and actively removes roadside litter. Green Team also assisted in the maintenance of Orchards Park, a city park, by hand-pulling weeds and thereby eliminating the need for a chemical herbicide application.

For the first time in our history, we participated in the Bentonville Christmas Parade by entering a scholar-constructed float.

Partnering with the Bentonville Public Library, scholars launched a book drive to benefit

elementary schools.

The City of Bentonville Letters to Santa program provided our scholars with a unique opportunity to serve the community. This past holiday season, our scholars replied to Santa letters written by area children.

Other schools in the community have also benefited from our support. Our scholars volunteer to work at the school carnivals and other fundraising events that provide financial support to the Parent Teacher Associations of the Arkansas Arts Academy and Old High Middle School.

Amazingly, our scholars have raised well over \$1,000 to support one of our own in his battle against aplastic anemia.
