## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Cedar Hill Independent School District Athletic Program is committed to excellence in academics and athletics. We are dedicated to Pursuing Victory with Honor, to adhering to the rules of competition and sportsmanship, producing champions in sports and in life, and to displaying the Six Pillars of Character (trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship) on and off the field. Along with the six pillars of character, the athletic department has adopted five core values: CHARACTER, LEADERSHIP, COMMITMENT, FAMILY and PROFESSIONALISM.

Cedar Hill High School offers a total of 20 sports for students in grades 9-12. There are 10 boys sports and 10 girls sports and currently over 900 students participants on these freshman, junior varsity or varsity Longhorns and Lady Longhorn athletic teams:

Fall/Winter Sports: Football, Volleyball, Boy's Cross Country, Girl's Cross Country, Boy's Basketball, Girl's Basketball, Boy's Soccer and Girl's Soccer

Spring Sports: Softball, Baseball, Boys Track and Girls Track, Boy's Powerlifting, and Girl's Powerlifting.

Sports with Fall and Spring Seasons: Tennis, Swimming and Golf

The class of 2009 included 28 Cedar Hill High School student-athletes that were awarded college scholarships to continue their athletic careers. The value of these scholarships totaled over \$1.4 million bringing the athletic department's total amount of athletic scholarships received by our athletes to over \$10 million.

Our two middle schools offer 6 sports for girls and 6 sports for boys in 7th-8th grades: Football, Cross Country, Volleyball, Golf, Tennis, Basketball, and Track. There were over 425 Permenter Middle School and 241 Bessie Coleman Middle School students that participated in athletics this year.

The athletic department staff includes one athletic director, one athletic coordinator, one health and physical education coordinator, one Para-professional, 17 head coaches, 34 high school assistant coaches, 26 middle school coaches, and 4 certified athletic trainers.

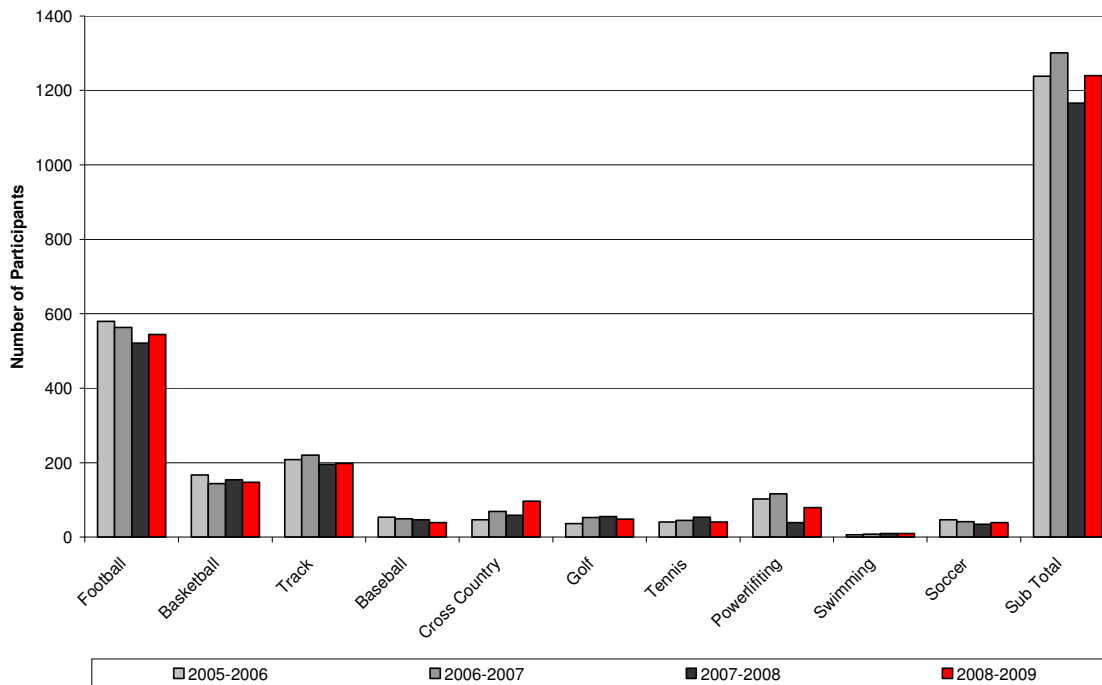

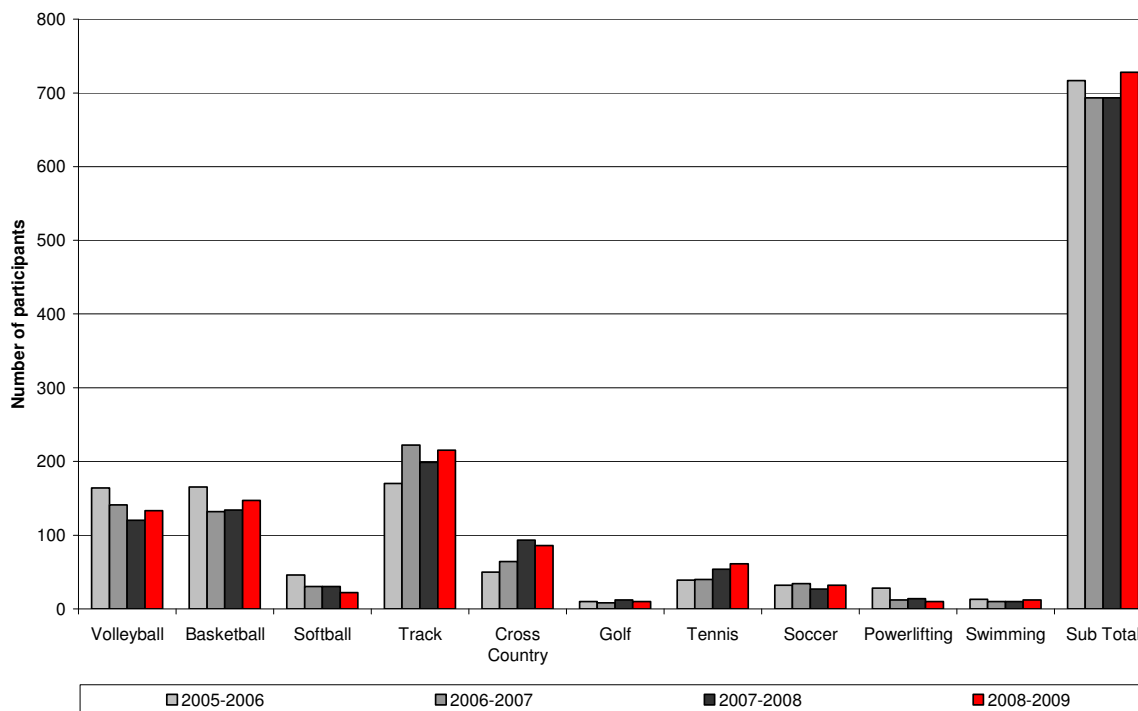


# PARTICIPATION BY GENDER AND SPORT

**CHISD 7-12 Grade Boys Athletic Participation**



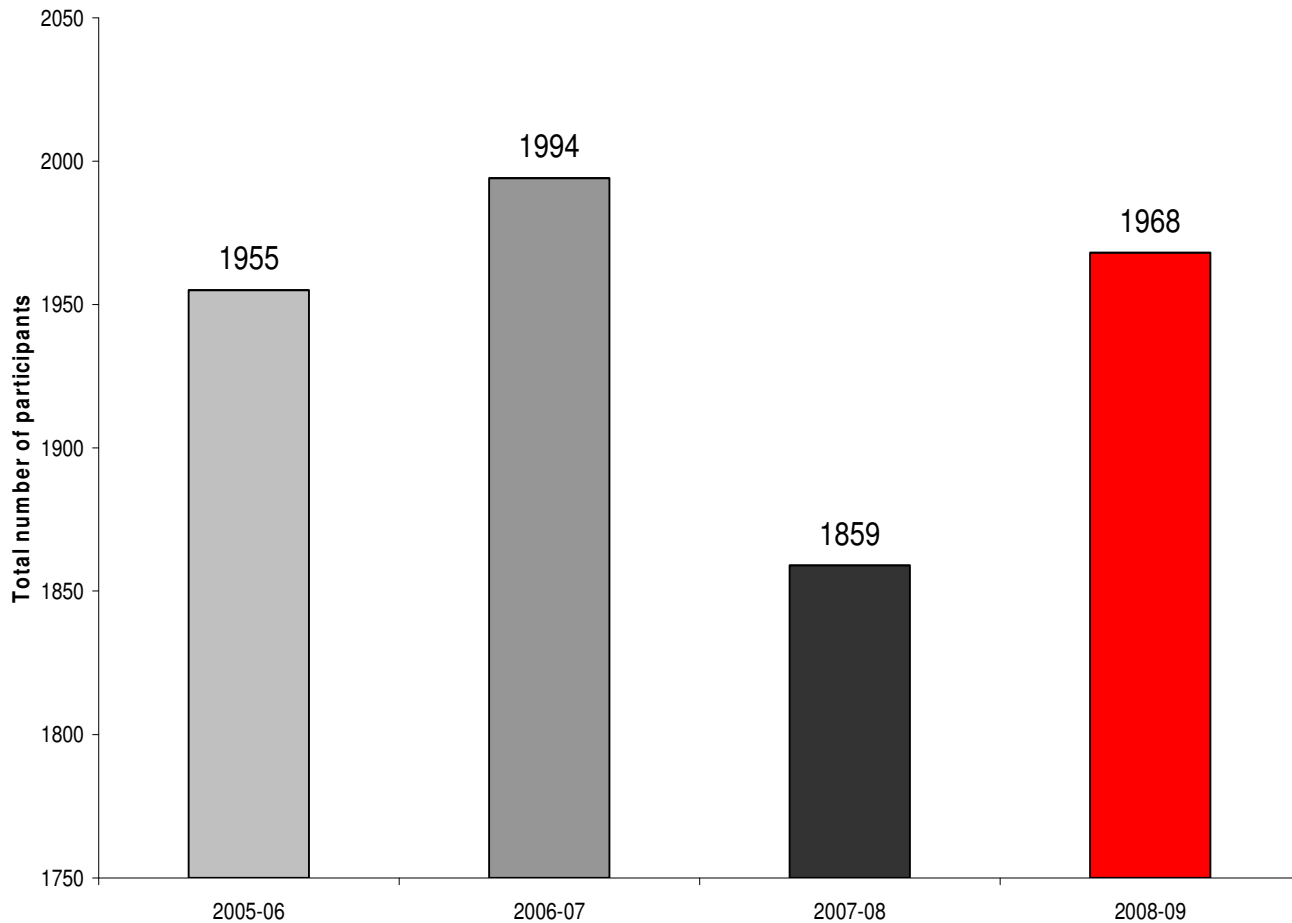
**CHISD 7-12 Grade Girls Athletics Participation**

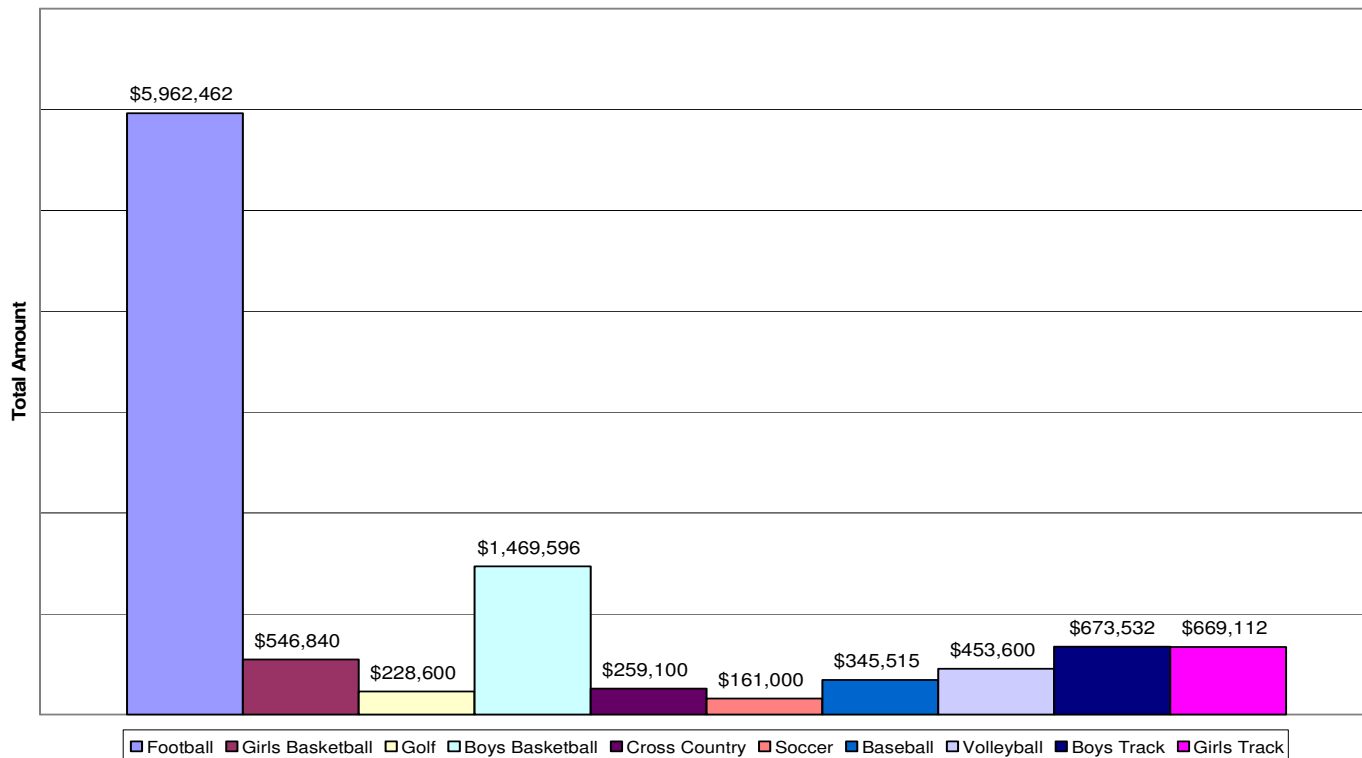

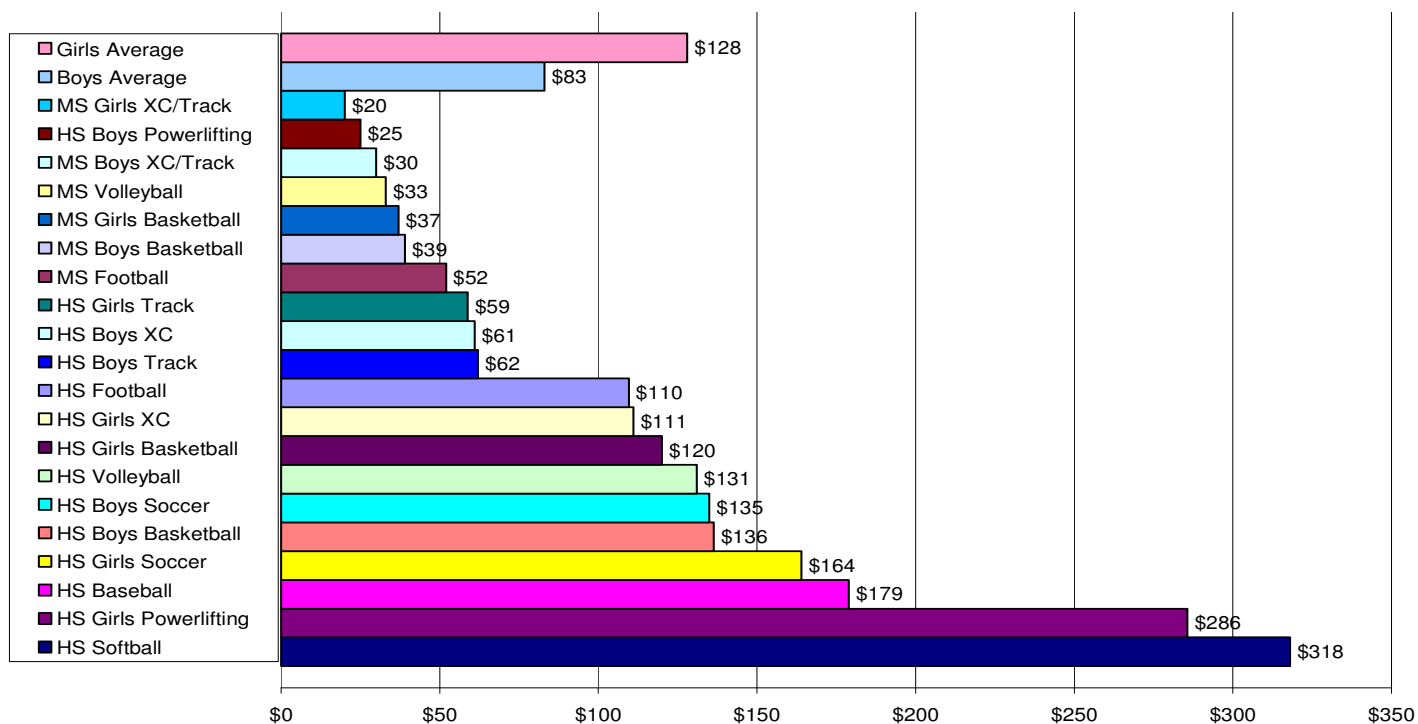

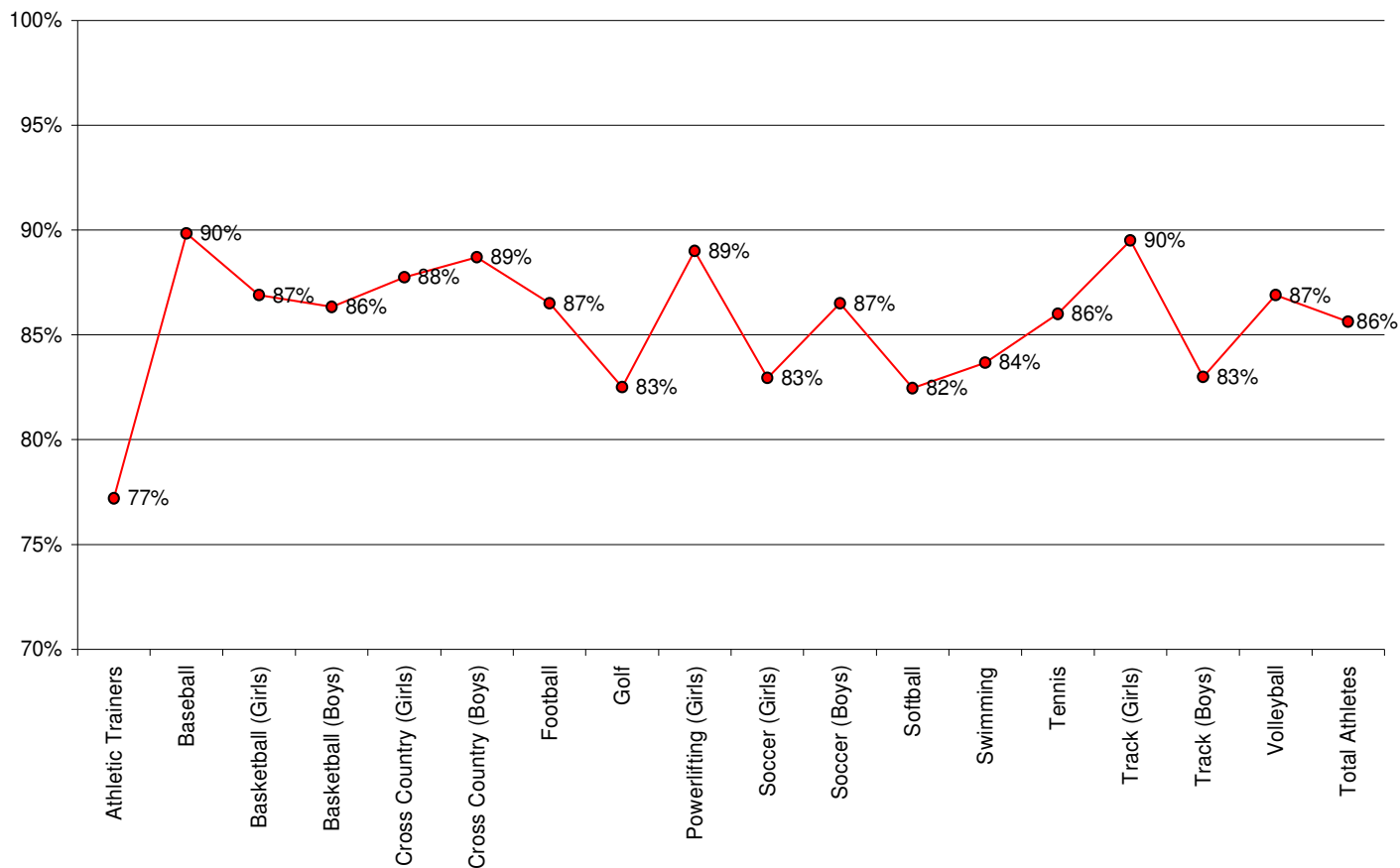
**2008-2009 CHISD Supply Cost per Athlete by Sport**
