- O Hosted by the Washington County Community Transition Interagency Committee (CTIC)
 - O CTIC is a group of Work or Transition Coordinators from school districts in Washington County and outside agency providers who come together to improve outcomes for students transitioning from school to adult life.



- O Currently 6 school districts send members to work on the committee
- O Outside agencies that have a consistent presence are Washington County Vocational Rehabilitation Services, Washington County Developmental Delay Services, State Services for the Blind, East Suburban Resources, Midwest Special Services and Goodwill/EasterSeals



- O The Committee
 - O Shares updates about legislation and programming/partnerships
 - O Works to plan and implement Career Skills Day
 - O Develops a Community Transition Resource Guide bi-annually
 - O Fulfills MDE requirements for an active CTIC committee



- O Participating schools send staff and students to partake in this event focused on celebrating student attainment of employability skills
- O Each district can send 10 students from each high school and 10 from their 18-21 Transition Program
 - O This year approximately 130 student participated



- O Eight Students participated
- O Competed in Interviewing Skills, General Knowledge, and Application Skills
- O Networked and Met with Vendors
