

Board Report for September 11, 2018



ATTENDANCE MATTERS (Parent) (submitted by Rebecca Rappold)

The KW/VINA Campus is working to improve our student attendance rate and have adopted a new attendance procedure in our buildings for this year. Daily, from 8:45-9:15 our building TAs will be contacting families of children who are not present when the classroom teacher takes daily attendance. TAs are making home contacts to ensure student safety and to communicate with parents the importance of being in school each day. Parent/guardian contacts are documented by the TA, the school secretary is printing and mailing 3, 5, 7, and 10 day letters to those parents/guardians of children missing consecutive days of school, and then the Tribal Court/Browning Public School process of cooperating with families to ensure student attendance begins after the 10 day letter has been sent. So far this year, for those 1st grade students who missed 40 or more days of school in Kindergarten the enrollment and attendance rate has been wonderful! Of the 47 students with 40 or more absences, 30 have been in attendance since the first day of school, 3 have transferred to another school or district, and 14 have not attended, but do continue to remain on the daily TA calling list. KW/Vina will continue to follow through will daily attendance procedures to ensure student attendance is strong, as well as focus on improving communication with the parents/guardians of Tier 2 & 3 students to improve their attendance and achievement.

The first week of school Pre-Kindergarten has a total of 53 students enrolled, Kindergarten an enrollment of 130 students, and First Grade a total of 139 students enrolled.

Establishing a safe, structured, and caring environment helps set the stage for all the academic learning that will happen this year.

After giving students a week or two to settle in, we will begin our Fall benchmark testing. We will be doing literacy assessments; ISIP and Phonics Survey as well as the Aimsweb, which gives us our baseline math data. Teachers are also getting to know their students through various formative assessments and observations. Our teachers have spent a great deal of time getting their rooms ready and welcoming for the new kiddos! They're motivated and looking forward to a great year!

First Grade

In addition, our math workshop framework and small reading group framework foundations are being laid and it won't be long before we have bustling classrooms of students working together independently.

First Grade Math/ELA
