- Commissioner will define groups of census blocks based on:
 - Median Household Income
 - Average Educational Attainment
 - % Single Parent Households
 - Rate of Home-ownership
 - Other??
- Districts will submit census tract to Agency, Agency will identify census group for each child



Career and Technology

 \$50 per student extra for P-Tech and New Tech (in addition to advanced CTE)

Extended Year Funding

- Provides for an increase in attendance for districts offering 30 additional half days (beyond 180) by the percentage of additional time attended.
- Applies to grades pk 5
- The commissioner may adopt rules to allow for 30 additional days beyond required minutes, rather than beyond 180 days
- This provision is not effective until FY 2021



Teacher Salary

- Current-law \$500 / \$250 allotment for non-teachers and nonadministrative staff is gone.
- New law:
 - In a year in which the basic allotment increases, a district must use 30% of the gain in FSP revenue per ADA for compensation increases to full time, nonadministrative staff, to be allocated as follows:
 - 75% for teachers, counselors, nurses and librarians (prioritizing differentiated compensation for classroom teachers with > 5 years of experience)
 - · 25% for other employees
 - Compensation includes benefits such as insurance premiums
 - Each district must submit report by staff member on compensation increase by December 1

Prekindergarten

- Districts must offer full day prekindergarten to eligible 4 year olds
- Second half of the day will not count for purpose of FSP funding
- Two three-year waivers are available
- Prior to seeking a waiver, districts must show lack of space or potentially reduced enrollment
- Prior to adding classrooms, districts must consider certain outside providers
- Early Education Allotment
 - · Designed to provide funding necessary to cover second half of the day
 - On a statewide basis, the funding is roughly sufficient
 - Whether HB 3 is sufficient will vary from district to district



Spending Restrictions

- Compensatory Education:
 - 55% must be used on supplemental services to prevent disparities between at risk and non-at risk students, economically disadvantaged and noneconomically disadvantaged students
 - Childcare and life skills programs are specifically allowed
 - 3 years can be used to monitor compliance
 - Can be spent in conjunction with Title 1 plan (no 40% low income requirement)
- Bilingual Education:
 - 55% must be used on supplemental services (full incremental cost of smaller class sizes is included)



Spending Restrictions

- 55 percent must be used on CTE programs in grades 7 through 12
- 55% of CCMR funds must be spent on improving CCMR

Efficiency Audits

- The board of trustees must contract out to conduct an efficiency audit not later than 4 months prior to holding a TRE;
- The district may, but does not have to use its audit firm for the efficiency audit;
- The firm must follow guidelines adopted by the LBB
