

# **November Board Report**

Greetings! The month of November consisted of 19 school days with one of those being staff only for a construction mishap in the main office. The mishap was due to a break in a pipe that was not sealed completely. There has been damage to the office area and to equipment and supplies but that is being take care of with an insurance claim.

Although the days seemed short, the month was full with instruction. The math teachers are focusing on Tier 1 instruction and they are also implementing the supplementary program, ALEKS, to provide Tier 2 and Tier 3 supports. The English/Language Arts (ELA) teachers are focusing on Tier 1 instruction and are also implementing the No Red Ink writing support. The 3 rules at BMS are Social Emotional based: Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be Safe. Short student reinforcement meetings are being held during student lunch times to promote positive outcomes and citizenship.

November was a busy month for athletics and the gymnasium was booming with students, parents and staff members. In November there were 28 Boys Basketball games hosted at the Browning Middle School and it was great to have packed crowds, exciting games and support for the students from families and staff. This year it was a goal to get the concessions up and running and this was a goal that was achieved. The BMS Clubs worked all but one game and the student involvement was positive. The BMS Clubs consist of the MBI/Culture team and the Rodeo Club.

The supplies were purchased out of the discretionary budget and the MBI/Culture Team has been working concessions to raise money to restock the student store.

The ribbon skirts and shirts/vests are for the 8th Grade Celebration at the end of the year. The MBI/Culture team is working with the local Native Life Store to purchase locally.
