Meeting Purpose

The purpose of this meeting was to further coordinate and clarify outstanding action items from the DISD / NCTCOG coordination meeting on April 4, 2012. At the April meeting, a handful of action items were developed on the topics of school siting, roadway improvement projects, and selfety/education outreach coordination.

Discussion Items

NCTCOS Staff solicited information from DISD regarding proposals for assistance with infrastructure improvements in the City of Denton. Specific items requested include: cost estimates, scope/boundaries, project desorptions, and a prioritization of project proposals Karla Weaver clarified that the cost estimates provided by DISD should include the following elements: PSE (design), right-of-way, and construction:

NCTCOG reported that staff contacted TxDOT following the last coordination meeting regarding assistance for the Safe Routes to School application process. Presently, TxDOT has requested that the City (or the primary applicant) contact them directly with specific questions regarding an application. TxDOT contact information was forwarded to Bud Vokoun (City of Denton).

DISD indicated that they are working with the City of Denton to develop Safe Routes application materials, but that they could use guidance to ensure that the application(s) materials are complete.

DISD provided a copy of the presentation given at the April meeting and provided electronic copies of current Safe Routes application materials. NCTCCG has agreed to continue to reach out to TxDCT and help identify any missing pieces to the SRTS application(s).

NCTCOG and DISD discussed the potential to collect and review all safety education and outreach materials currently being used/developed by both agencies. DISD indicated that the assistant principals at each campus would be the appropriate point-of-contact regarding outreach materials as this is typically handled at the campus level.

DISD indicated that the Hispanic population within their boundary is projected to continue to grow and that targeting outreach material to this population would likely be effective. DISD has resources to assist translating outreach materials to Spanish.

DISD and NCTCOG agreed to continue to develop/collect outreach materials for a review meeting to occur at the end of summer.

DISD indicated that the Denton Bike Plan includes an education component intended for cyclists, and DCTA has given safety presentations targeted toward schools located along the rail transit time.

DISD reported that currently 21 elementary schools, 7 middle schools, 3 high schools, 1 alternative high school, and 2 pre-K schools exist in DISD. Currently enrullment is approximately 25,000, and is expected to grow to 35,000 in 10 years.

NCTCOG presented draft versions of map documents and accompanying tables indicated approved TXDOT roadway projects within DISD boundaries. Information included in the documents included, project location, project type, project description, funding amounts,

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estimated let dates, etc. DISD provided feedback for modifications to the maps.

NCTCOG informed DISD that Staff is currently working on an application for the CDC funded Community Transformation Grant program. The intent of the grant proposal is to provide planning assistance to perfine organizations (i.e. cities, ISDs, health departments, etc.) to improve health among the student aged population in the target area(s).
