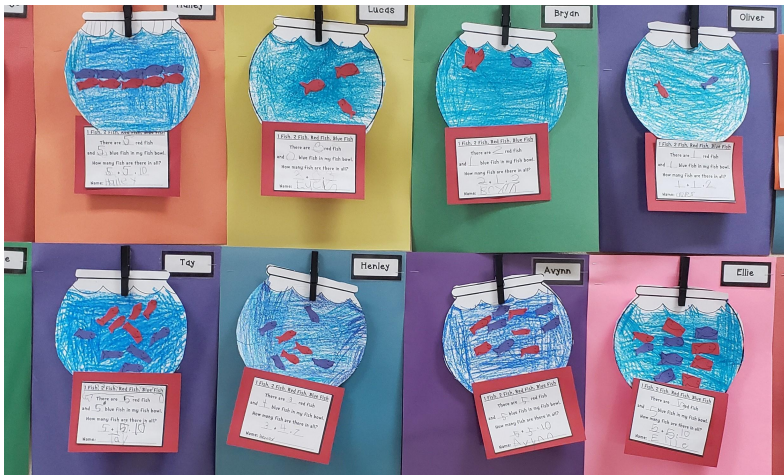
**Do you like green eggs and ham?**

One Fish, Two Fish counting



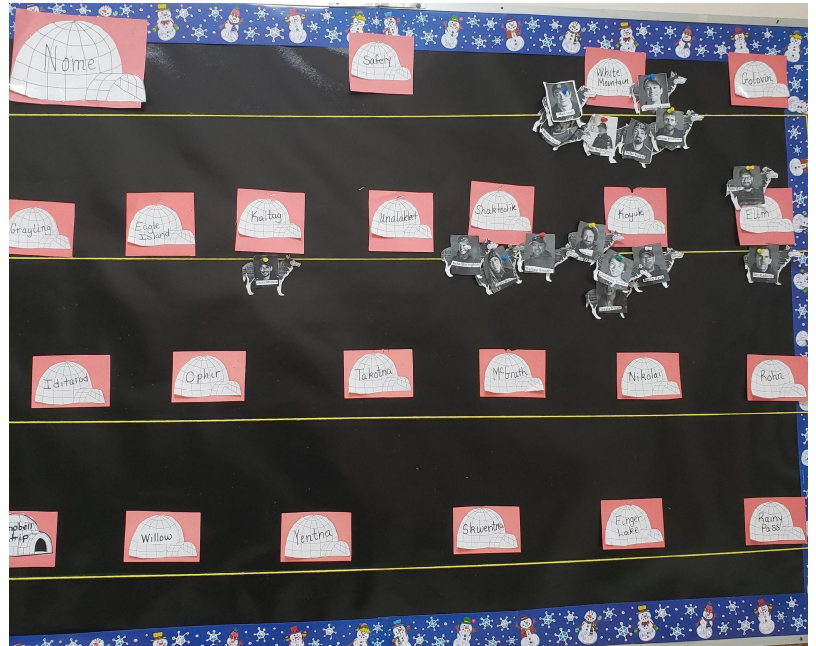
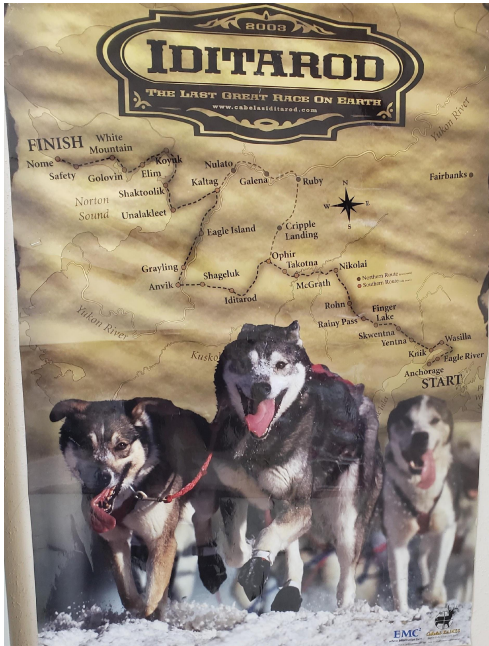

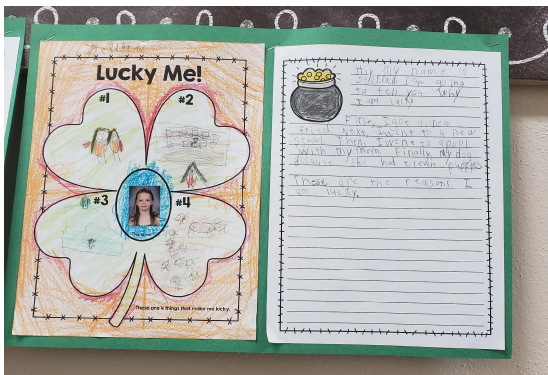


**Silly Socks and crazy hair show up on a Wacky Wednesday!**
