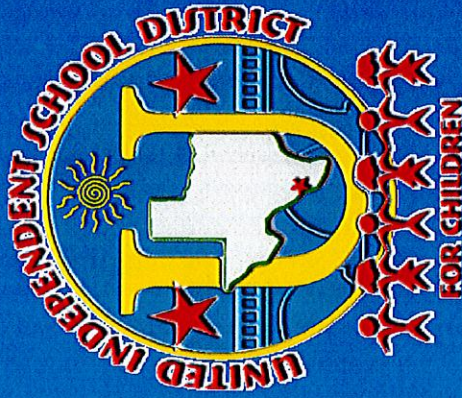

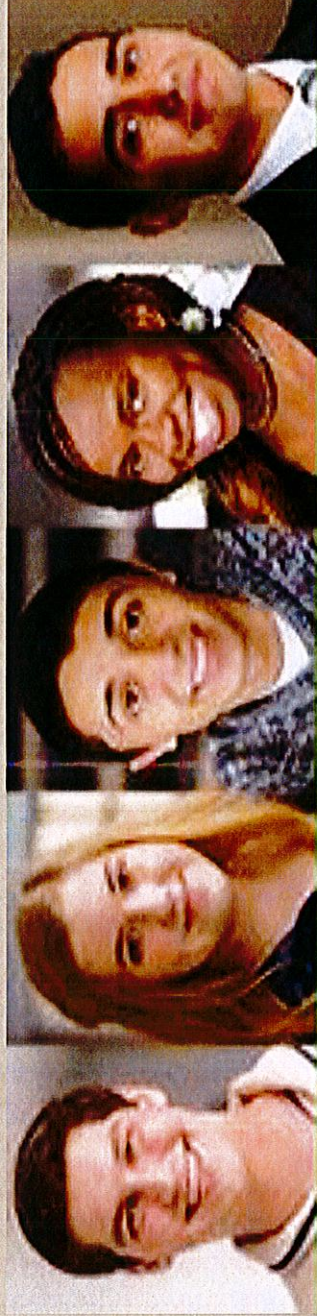

# CollegeBoard

- Out of approximately 1251 school districts in Texas
- Only 39 were selected by College Board from Texas
- 547 school districts in the U.S. and Canada were selected



- Based on three years of AP data, from 2012-2014
- Across 34 AP Exams
- Including World Language and Culture

- Increase participation/access to AP by at least 6 percent in medium districts
- Increase or maintain the percentage of exams taken by African American, Hispanic/Latino, and American Indian/Alaska Native students
- Improve performance levels when comparing the percentage of students in 2014 scoring a 3 or higher to those in 2012<sup>5</sup>

- 30 percent or more are underrepresented minority students and/or
- 30 percent or more are low-income students
- A symbol has been affixed to the district name to highlight this work.
