Major Change in Calculating the District Rating

Proposed District Rating Updates: Proportional Domain Ratings

To align district ratings more closely with the campuses they serve, the agency will calculate district domain ratings using a proportionality method. The proposed methodology will only consider enrollment counts for grades 3–12, exclude *Not Rated* and paired campuses, be applied to each domain, and include campuses evaluated under alternative education accountability.

Step 1: Determine the Proportional Weight for Each Campus

Step 2: Determine the Proportional Points Each Campus Contributes to the District Domain Score

Rationale: Calculating district ratings proportionately using the outcomes of the campuses they serve increases the alignment of district and campus ratings.

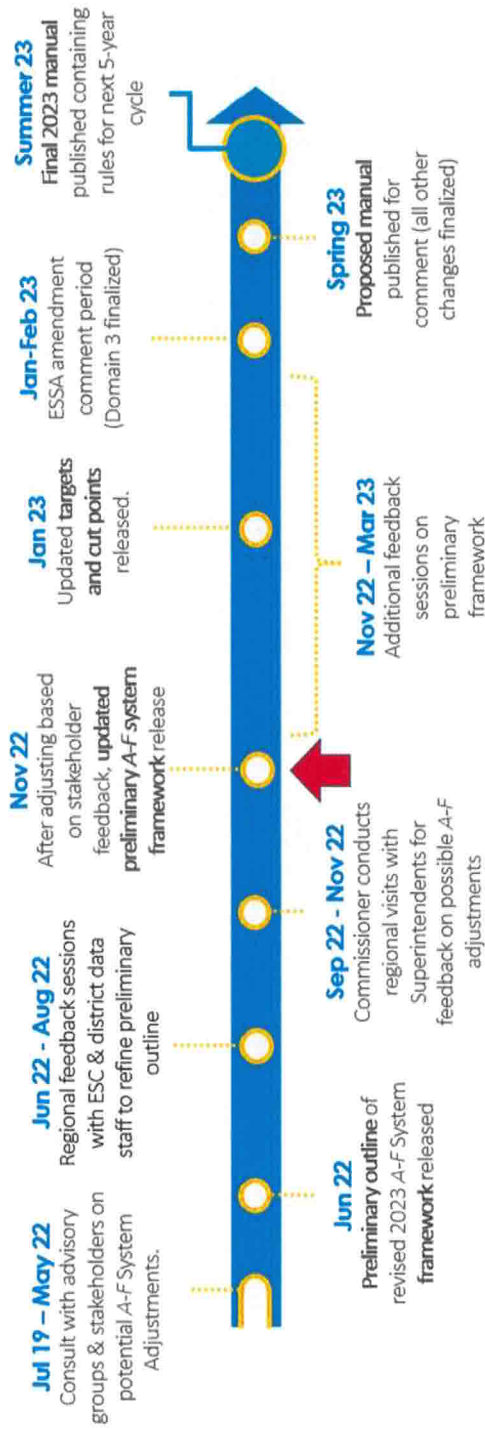

- TEA proposes to complete Accountability Ratings in Late August or Early September.
- TEA is phasing out some of the options for students to earn CCMR points.
