## **Keeling Elementary School**

#### **Academic Goals:**

- Every child, without exception, will be proficient in all academic areas.
- All students will be reading at or above grade level by the end of the school year.
- All students will perform at or above grade level in math by the end of the school year.

Helen Keeling, after whom Amphitheater's second elementary school was named, came to our district in the fall of 1930. Prior to her arrival in Tucson, Mrs. Keeling was a teacher and principal in Douglas and County Superintendent in Tombstone. Helen Keeling was proud of having begun her teaching during Arizona Territorial days. Always a leader in education, in 1922 Helen Keeling was elected president of the Arizona Education Association, the first woman to head the organization.

Amphitheater needed an additional teacher for overflowing second and third grades in 1930 and Mrs. Keeling got the job, beginning in October. Her salary was \$155.55 a month. She became a principal for Amphitheater in 1933. She continued directing Amphitheater Elementary Schools until retirement in 1957.

In 1947, Amphitheater district opened its second elementary school and the name was changed from its temporary designation as "Coronado Heights" to Helen Keeling Elementary School. Mrs. Bertha Shires became head of the new school.
