For Costume Design, Jackie had to submit the following.

- 1. An Inspiration Board

- 3. Full Colored Rendering for the Costume for Any Female Character (with swatches)
- 4. Full Colored Sketch of 3 Characters in One Scene (this is to show how the costumes coordinate with one another.)
- 5. A Prompt Statement
- 6. Justification Essay

Jackie will work to make improvements to her pieces based on the feedback given to her by the judges, and then she will submit the updated work for the state contest in Austin on May 3rd and 4th. There, not only will Jackie get to present her superb work, but she will also be able to learn from other state caliber artists as well as have opportunities to receive scholarships for college.
