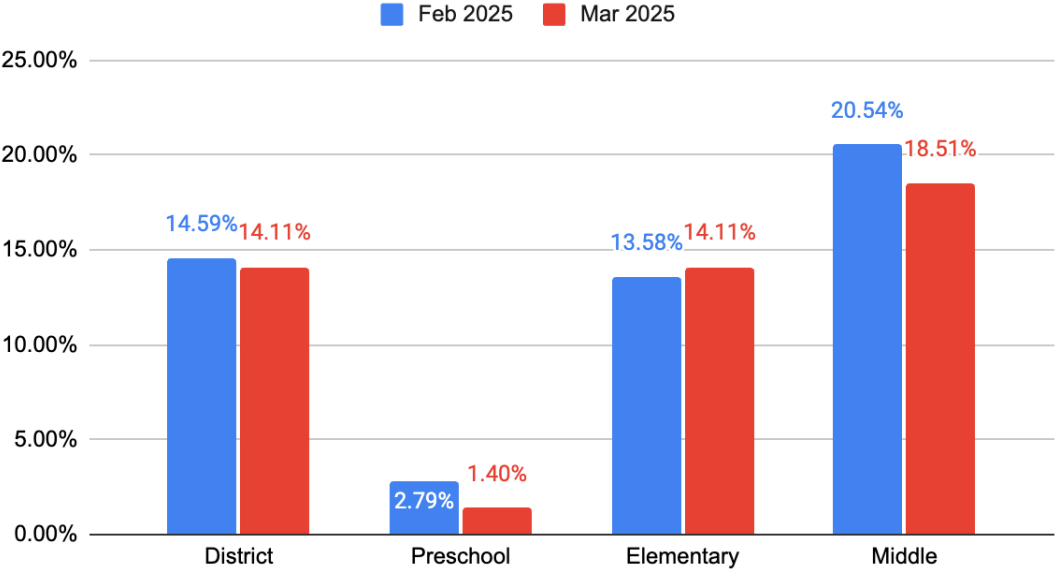

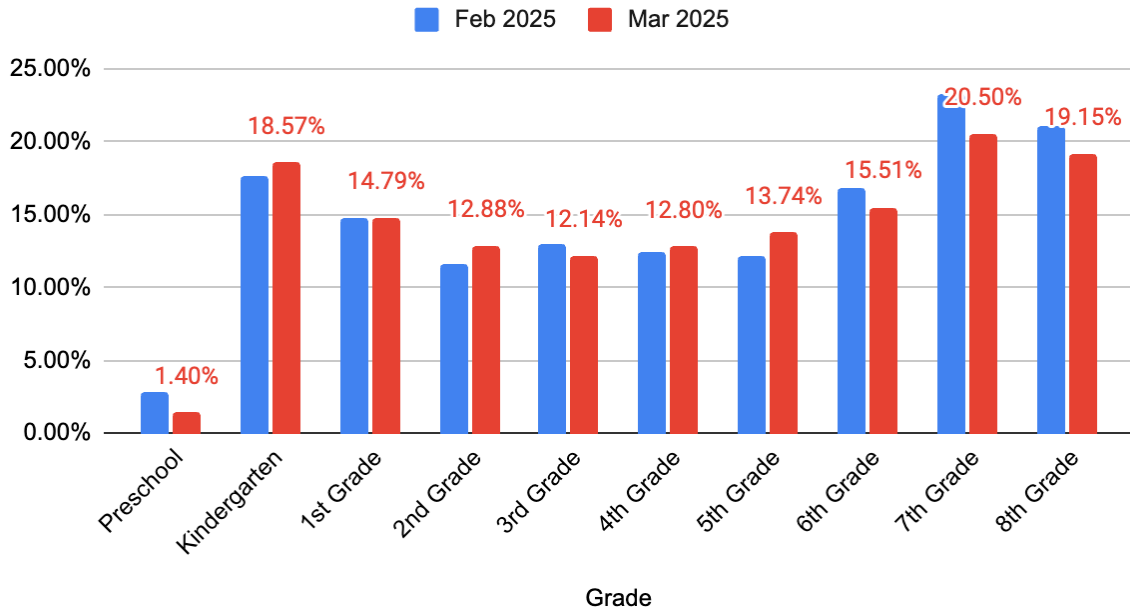

Basic information:
As of March 11, 2025, we have been in school for 114 days. Districtwide chronic absenteeism is at 14.11% (total of 457 students), which is a slight decrease from last month's report. The building attendance teams and family liaisons have been working with families to get the students to school as much as possible as well as providing resources for families.
Students missing 10% or more of the school days are considered chronically absent. These percentages include both excused and unexcused absences. Please see the following charts for a breakdown by grade level bands as well as each grade level (comparing last month to this month).
School attendance teams continue to meet in each school. Assistant principals are working with the teams to track and monitor student attendance at the building level. The teams are actively working with monitoring the attendance, informing families if there is an attendance concern, and taking the time to support families as needed so students can come to each day. They also continue to implement school-wide attendance incentives to promote perfect attendance.
Background or historical information:
Our school report cards was published on October 30, 2024. Based on the Illinois School Report Card, District 33 had a rate of 19.6% in chronic absenteeism compared to the state average of 26.3%. Our truancy rate was 13.9% whereas the state average was 20%.
