

#### **NSBA Delegate Assembly in Orlando**

Our Oregon delegates also worked to improve resolutions before the body today and did an excellent job working collaboratively with our state associations to include more inclusive language in beliefs and resolutions presented during delegate assembly. The Pacific Region provided guidance to other regions on how to create a successful system of monthly meetings, communication and planning as a region. We will work on sharing our structure with the realigned regions. This year we also had representation from Oregon at the national level- **Jim Green** OSBA Executive Director serves on the <u>National School Board Association Board of Directors</u>, as Chair of the Organization of State Association Executive Directors. Secondly **Sami Al-Abdrabbuh** Serves on the <u>National School Board Association Board of Directors</u> representing the Pacific Region.



#### What is NSBA delegate Assembly?

In essence, the Delegate Assembly is NSBA's legislature. It adopts its own rules of procedure and hears and acts upon its committee reports. The Delegate Assembly meets at least once each year, at the time of the NSBA Conference, and the President and Executive Director of NSBA serve as President and Secretary of the Assembly, respectfully

#### How are delegates selected?

Each State Association Member selects its delegates according to its own procedures. The only requirement is that a delegate be a school board member and not an employee of a state association. Members of NSBA's Board of Directors serve as ex officio nonvoting delegates if they have not been selected as voting delegates from their state.

#### WORK OF THE NSBA DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

The decisions you make on April 1 will establish the policies that govern NSBA and provide direction for the advocacy work of the association. Now more than ever, public education must be our nation's top priority. NSBA's strong legislative, legal, and public advocacy on behalf of public education and local school governance leads the way toward that goal! The Delegate Assembly will be considering proposed Beliefs & Resolutions. Beliefs are the enduring principles of NSBA and form the philosophical basis of the association and its work. Resolutions exist for one year and form the advocacy agenda for the year, as we seek to influence legislation, legal decisions, and other governmental policy decisions. **During the 2023 Delegate assembly 6 Bylaws and 40 Beliefs and resolutions were approved.** 

## **NSBA Pacific Region/Delegate Assembly**

On March 23<sup>rd</sup> as Pacific Region Chair I met with delegates from the Pacific region, and we reviewed each by-law, belief and resolution and listened for feedback and/or suggestions for edits modifications that we would present as a region during the delegate assembly. 

**CENTRAL REGION**: ALABAMA, ARKANSAS, COLORADO, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, KANSAS, Kentucky, LOUISIANA, Michigan, Minnesota, MISSISSIPPI, Missouri, MONTANA, NEBRASKA, NEW MEXICO, NORTH DAKOTA, Ohio, OKLAHOMA, SOUTH DAKOTA, TENNESSEE, TEXAS, and Wisconsin, AND WYOMING.

**EASTERN** REGION: Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia,

## **Realignment of NSBA Regions**

FLORIDA, GEORGIA, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, NORTH CAROLINA, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, SOUTH CAROLINA, Vermont, and VIRGINIA, Virgin Islands, AND WEST VIRGINIA.

**PACIFIC REGION**: Alaska, Arizona, California, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington.

- 2. CURRENT REGIONAL DIRECTORS WILL REMAIN IN THEIR SEATS UNTIL
  THEIR TERMS EXPIRE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DESIGNATION OF
  REGIONS. THE NSBA BOARD WILL DEVELOP IN BOARD POLICY A
  TRANSITION PLAN TO FILL VACANCIES.
- 3. THE CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS COMMITTEE SHALL REVIEW THE
  DESIGNATION OF REGIONS YEARLY. CONFORMING LANGUAGE
  CHANGES ARE AUTHORIZED TO THE NSBA CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS
  REFLECTING THESE PROVISIONS.
