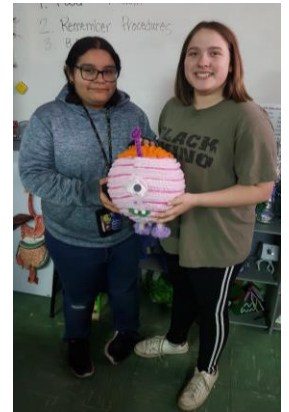

Photo/Film students chose a famous person to research and use for a six weeks long project. After selecting a famous person, students use their research and citation skills to complete a 500 word research paper about their famous person. This research paper is checked for sources and run through a plagiarism checker that shows students how we can check for copying and pasting from online. This research paper is then used to complete a Timeline Poster of their famous person's life. Students create this poster in Google Drawings. After the research paper and timeline are complete, students partner up with someone with a different famous person than them and write an interview script in character asking each other 10 questions. These scripts will be used for an animation using Plotagon as well as a video interview with the Green Screen. I have attached some samples of student timelines.
