

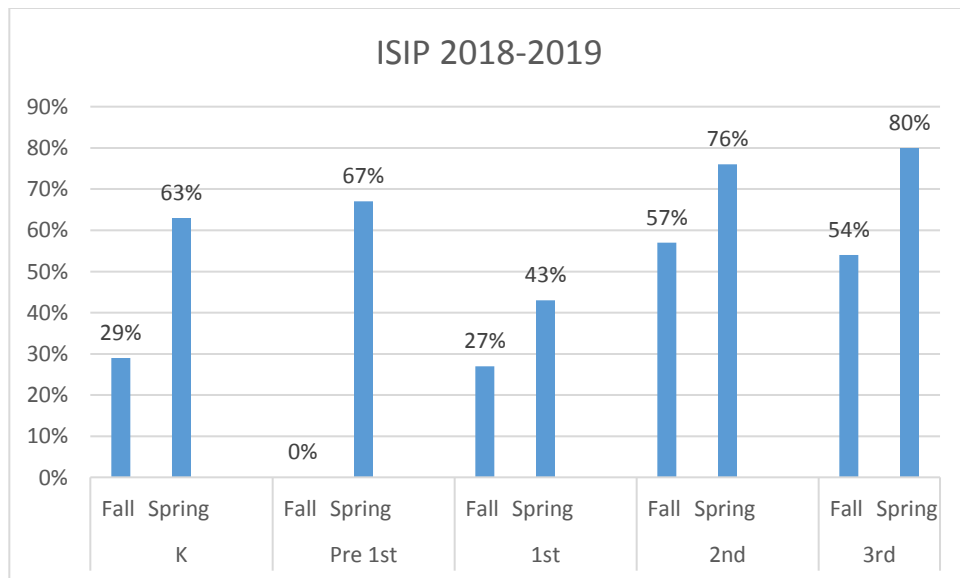

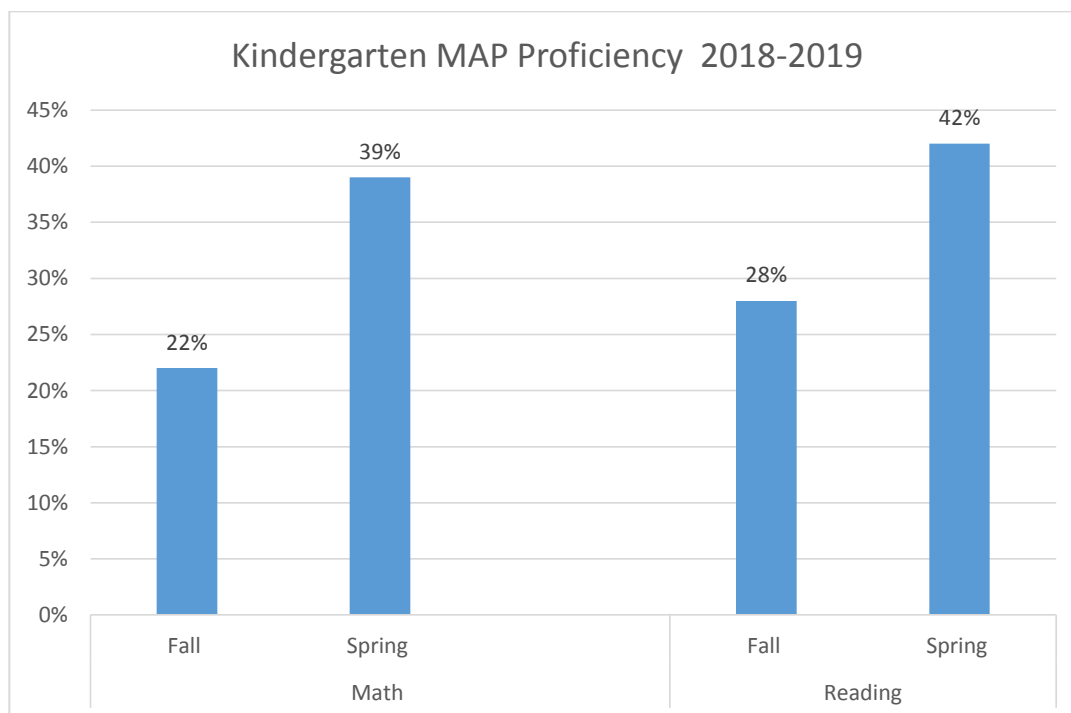

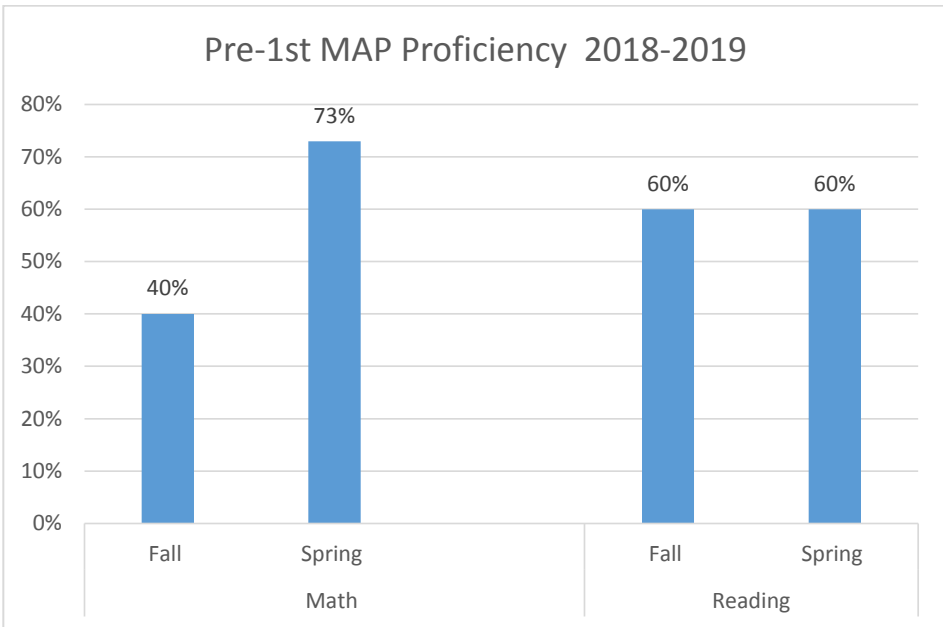
Idaho Reading Indicator:



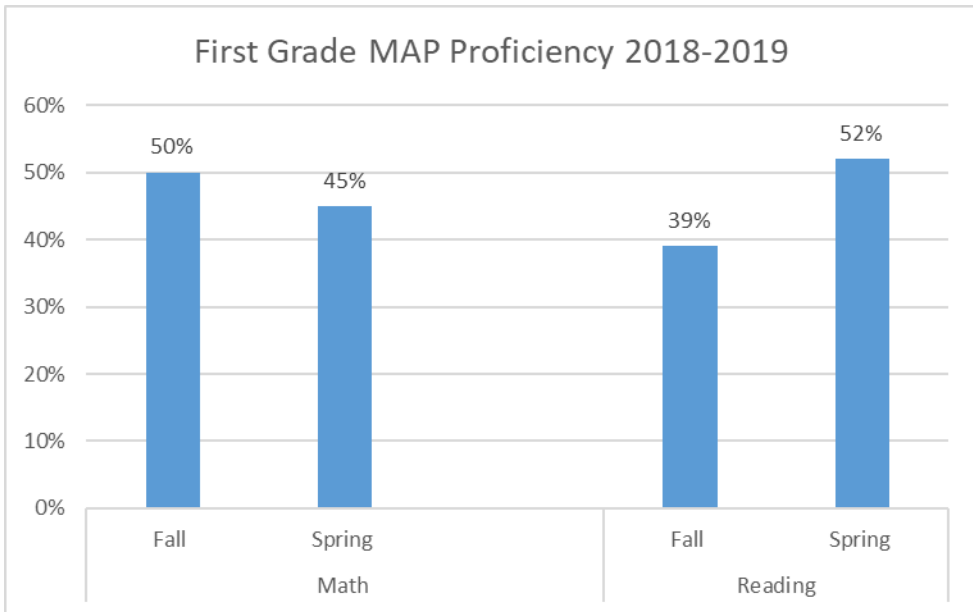

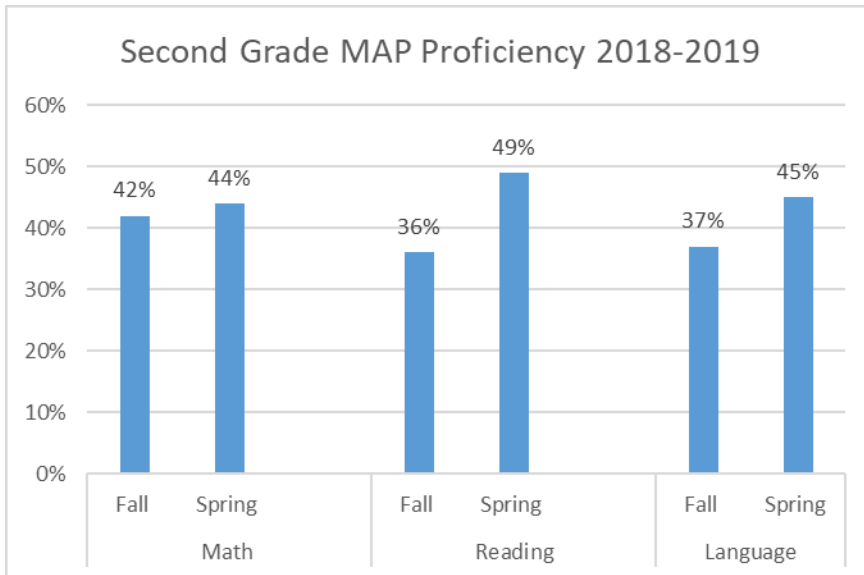
Adequate growth for one year in Math is 19 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 55% who met their Math goal, and 72% who met their Reading goal.



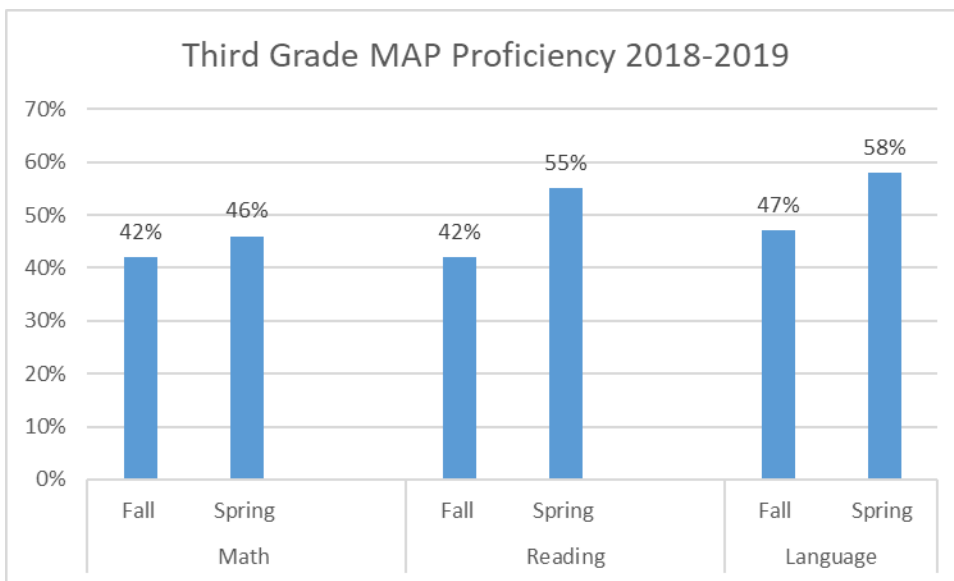
Adequate growth for one year in Math is 19 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 60% who met their Math goal, and 53% met their Reading goal.



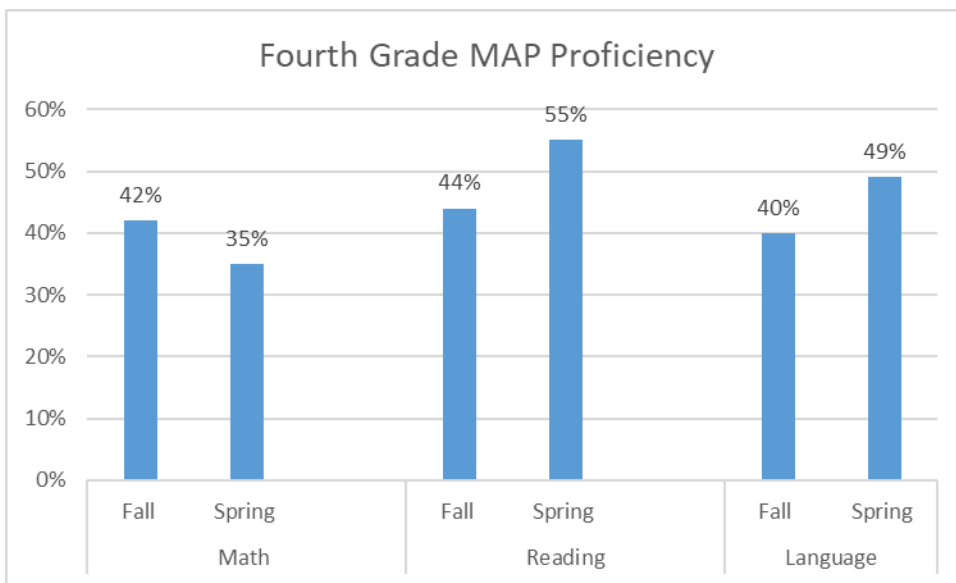
Adequate growth for one year in Math is 18 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 67% who met their Math goal, and 72% met their Reading goal.



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 15 RIT points, Reading is 14 RIT points, Language is 15 RIT points. There were 62% who met their Language goal, 62% met their Math goal, and 71% met their Reading goal.



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 13 RIT points, Reading is 10 RIT points, Language is 11 RIT points. There were 63% who met their Language goal, 61% met their Math goal, and 66% met their Reading goal.



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 12 RIT points, Reading is 8 RIT points, Language is 8 RIT points. There were 69% who met their Language goal, 54% met their Math goal, and 72% met their Reading goal.

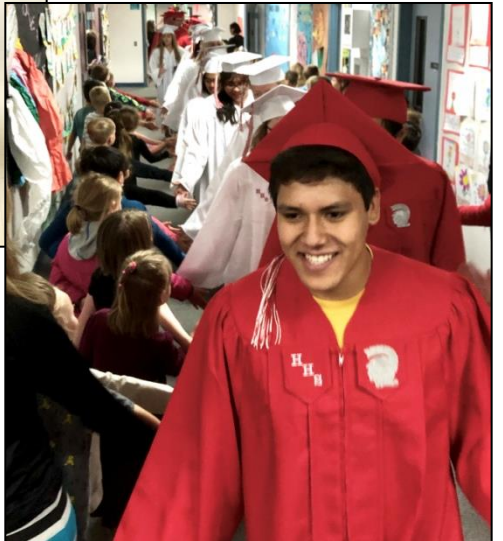

The 2nd grade students read 2,110 books. The 3rd grade students read 3,000 books, and 4th grade read 3,630 books. This year the students read 10,790 books!
