Instructional Coaches

Wow, how time flies! Although this month seems a little shorter due to late starts, the Instructional coaches stayed busy by providing pop-up PD's on several areas of need such as Dreambox math, Wonders data, and ways to use the data when assessing. We are currently taking part in voicing our input as part of the Literacy Grant committee.

This month we completed our second cycle of the MAST testing in both ELA and Math. The Napi Leadership team is reviewing our ELA curriculum and exploring several options that may meet our future needs in regards to the science of reading. On February 25th, the Napi team hosted the February Board meeting to show our awesome data and highlight some of the wonderful things the staff are doing as a TEAM! Way to go, Napi! We also hosted the coaches' collaboration in our building this month.

On February 4th, we started our 4th grade Walk to Math based on the AimsWeb math data. Based on the data and areas of need using the place value standards we have 1 teacher teaching T1 students, 2 teachers teaching T2 students, 2 teachers teaching high T3 students and 3 teachers teaching low T3 students. At this time, our Walk to Math has been successful and students are becoming very confident with the group of students they are currently placed with and the lessons that are being taught.

At the end of the month, we met with Julie Gavin, our OPI support person in our school improvement status, and the leadership team went to several ELA classrooms to observe the classes in walkthroughs to determine how well our frameworks are set in place and are successful.

The instructional coaches currently have 8 continuous coaching cycles at this time. The main focus is to ensure that all teachers are supported in the frameworks, data collection and analysis, and application of teaching strategies that are known best practices.
