#### **PROPOSED REVISIONS: 7.8.2024**

Consistent Application for Graduating Class	The District shall apply the same class rank calculation method and rules for local graduation honors for all students in a graduat- ing class, regardless of the school year in which a student first earned high school credit.				
Dual Credit	In order to receive the high school credit portion of a dual credit course, the District has determined that the course provides ad- vanced academic instruction and the course grade shall be at least 70 on the college grading scale. Although a grade of 60 is consid- ered passing on the college-level grading scale, high school credit is not awarded. If a student earns a college grade of 69 or below, the student shall recover the high school credit if the course or credit is required for high school graduation. This shall require the student to retake the high school equivalent course. [See EI and EHDD]				
Calculation	The District shall include in the calculation of class rank semester grades earned in high school credit courses taken in the following subject areas only: English, mathematics, science, social studies, and languages other than English.				
	The class rank calculation shall not include semester grades from a course that is retaken after a passing grade has been earned, and the new grade shall not be recorded on the tran- script.				
	The calculation shall include failing grades.

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The District shall assign weights to semester grades earned in eligible courses and shall calculate a weighted numerical grade average in accordance with the following:

Honors	plus 10
Regular	plus 0

Points shall be added to failing grades.

The District shall record unweighted numerical grades on student transcripts.

A student in a designated weighted course who does not maintain a passing grade of a 70 or above for a nine-week period shall be placed on academic probation for the next nine-week period. If at the end of that grading period the student is not passing with a grade of a 70 or above, he or she shall be rescheduled into a regular course.

Highest-Ranking Graduate	The student meeting the local eligibility criteria for recognition as the valedictorian shall also be considered the highest-ranking grad- uate for purposes of receiving the honor graduate certificate from the state of Texas.
