BHS Responsible Use Curriculum

Bison Time, grade 9:

Ninth grade students will receive this instruction during twenty minute Bison Times on either Tuesdays or Thursdays. Their Bison Time teacher, counselor, school resource officer, or member of the administrative team will facilitate these learning opportunities.

Students will review and sign off on the District's Acceptable Use Policy. Students will also receive an understanding of what it means to have a positive digital footprint, how to stay safe in their use of technology, and how to appropriately use digital communication and social networking sites both in and outside of school.
