Alternative School Transition

Executive Summary: The goal of this transition is to move the Alternative School out of the central office on Main Street and bring it back to the high school building. To make this transition happen, several transitions must take place to comply with the state's rules and regulations for alternative schools.

- 1. Moving the weight room into the wrestling room.
- 2. Moving Cory from his current location out to the weight room.
- 3. Transforming Cory's space into Alternative School.

Phase 1: Weight Room → Wrestling Room

Key Benefits

- Areas very similar in size (40' x 60' vs. 40' x 57')
- Allows for a productive use of the wrestling room space
- · Gives students access to restroom facilities
- Provides a much safer environment
 - Students will be able to hear announcements through the intercom system. This becomes especially important in the case of a lockdown or a lockout.
 - Students using the weight room would not have to walk outside in the elements during the winter.
 - o Decreased traffic in and out will improve cleanliness with snow, dirt, and mud.

Requirements

- Wrestling room currently can only be accessed via boys locker room
- To make it equally accessible for boys and girls, would need to cut two doorways in through the coaches offices
- Athletic storage in coaches offices will need to be moved to the old weight room (outdoors). Will allow for streamlining of athletic storage.
- Improved lighting; current wrestling room lighting is not sufficient.

Phase 2: Cory's Area → Old Weight Room

Key Benefits

- Allows for better storage for all buildings and grounds supplies, tools, etc.
- Opens up space in the high school for Alternative School

Requirements

- Replace Carpet
- Remove Wall

Phase 3: Alternative School → Cory's Area

Key Benefits

- Allows access to all of the resources within the building (lunch program, Special Ed, Physical Education)
- SDI time for students who are in special education
- Team approach to alternative learning vs one person

- Consistency with behaviors, discipline, attendance policies, schedule.
- Access to co-curricular, extra-curricular, special classes
- Full inclusion atmosphere
- Quick access to an outside door and private restroom

Potential Costs

- ★ Flooring system
 - o Rubber 3/4 inch 4x6 sheets \$14,000
- ★ Doors
 - o 3 doors (\$5,600)
- ★ Installation of doors
 - \$1,800 (KR Construction)
- ★ Lighting
 - \$2,000k (12 LED Lights \$167)
- ★ Benches
 - o 800 (2 8 ft aluminum benches)
- ★ Storage racks for athletic uniforms
 - o Racks 180 each x2 = \$360
 - o Tubs Black tubs 27 Gallon 20 Totes (\$12.50 each = \$250)
- ★ Carpet in Cory's office
 - 0 1700
- ★ Miscellaneous
 - o \$1,500
