ACADEMICS:

Preparations continue for the upcoming testing season as the ACT will be held on Tuesday, March 11, and the PreACT Secure will be conducted on Tuesday, March 18. Both of these tests are used to shape our accountability report card and as such, we have been working with our students in an effort to best prepare them. One of the resources that we continue to implement is IXL with high school teachers utilizing student scores from our October testing session to create individualized test prep plans. While we still have a learning curve in front of us when it comes to IXL and the influence it can have on our students' learning, we continue to be impressed by its capabilities; more importantly, we have been impressed with our students' willingness to engage with it at a high level. We are hopeful (perhaps confident) that our focused work will lead to noticeable improvements in our students' results - which will be available later this spring.

We are nearly one month into the second quarter, and the third quarter installment of COMPASS has begun. We are seeing good results early this quarter and the volume of failures in the middle school has decreased noticeably when compared to the same time frame of the second quarter. On the opposite end of the spectrum, we had 62 high school students earn "High Honor Roll" distinction (3.75 GPA or higher) and an additional 63 high school students earn "Honor Roll" distinction. In the middle school, those numbers were - 38 students designated as earning "High Honors" and an additional forty six students earning "Honors." The office staff have been working to reimplement our Academic Distinction program and look forward to hosting a ceremony in the near future in which students will be recognized for their academic achievements through the receipt of academic letters and corresponding pins.

In addition to these dual-credit opportunities, we are also adding a new course in our English Department -Communications - as well as an enhanced version of Youth Apprenticeship in which we will support students in the pursuit of industry-certifications. Upon approval of these new courses, the Academic and Career Planning Guide will be formatted and made available to students and parents by the end of February.

We also continue to recognize our students who secure perfect attendance on a monthly basis in the middle school. Our middle school data to date shows the following -
